Bangladesh Festival in London

What is Bangladesh to the rest of the world?

Is it only an obscure land ridden with floods, famine and poverty or is there anything posi-

There is no dirth of love for this country among its citizens. That undeniable bond and pride are of course there but the people have somehow not been able to promote Bangladesh to the outside world in a very positive light.

The London festival of Bangladesh, the largest ever celebration of Bangladeshi culture and commercial prospects in Britain, is taking place in London this July.

"The main purpose of this grand and spectacular show is to project the culture and people of this frequently misunderstood nation," says Amin Ali, one of the main organisers

of the festival, and also Britain's best known
Bangladeshi businessman, the founder of the Red Fort
restaurants. Iqbal
Wahhab is another
organiser.

"People here only know my country by its tragedies," as a victim of natural calamity, as a politically instable country and so on; that's why I want to show that there is more to Bangladesh than misery, Ali explains. This show is basically the portrayal of the country's positive, rich, cultural heritage.

Amin Ali has always arranged such
ventures but on a
small scale. The
textile exhibition
entitled "Woven Air"
in 1988 or the recent cultural programme in the
House of Commons
by an Asian singer

Shabnam Mustari goes to his credit, besides many other charitable works. Initial plan for this festival was also on a small scale but how it became such a big event is something that makes even Ali wonder.

"The London festival of Bangladesh is a celebration not just of Bangladesh, but also of the rich cosmopolitan mix of London itself," he says. Every year Shri Lanka. Malaysia, India, and a few of Bangladesh's neighbouring countries hold such festivals to promote their country and this initiative is always supported by their governments. But the London festival of Bangladeshi is only arranged by the private sector. "So far the Bangladesh government has shown no interest in it," says Ali, currently chairman of the British Bangladeshi Friendship Society.

"Even the trade houses here are not showing any positive signs," says Ali. "The businessmen here are convinced but since there
might be no initial gain their interest somehow
is shadowed," Ali adds sadly. But Ali being a farsighted man feels that this will help in the fu-

money from business organizations here, just

their participation," says Ali.

In fact, all the participants, who must enroll within 10 days from now, in the trade fair will be given an ideal opportunity to develop business links with Britain. "We will promote them heavily in the business and trade media in Britain," promises Ali. All he wants is for the Bangladesh-based companies to promote their

Their lack of interest is very unfortunate, he thinks. "Initially we thought that we would reach break-even point but now we are incurring a heavy loss, still then the show will go on, maybe, we'll add more funds to it again," says Ali quite determinedly.

The festival is being held in the Spitalfields Market in the city of London. Fifty Bangladeshi

companies will be holding displays and making presentations to British companies for them to investigate the possibilities of establishing greater commercial ties.

There will also be

a seminar "Doing Business with Bangladesh," on July 1 which will be addressed by Foreign Minister Mustalizur Rahman and Bangladesh High Commissioner in London Dr A F M Yusuf. Britain will be represented by a government minister and British High Commissioner to Bangladesh P J Fowler.

This festival is being run as a charitable concern and is being funded entirely by donation

Photographic exhibitions, paintings by Shafique Uddin, 'Shadows and Light' Asian photography competition, Images of Bangladesh and a children's painting competition are also included. A Brick Lane photography workshop by Ashim Goshe and Onno Choke Dekha, an exhibition of 40 photographs. by 10 female Bangladeshi photographers will be held.

In addition, there will be a trade fair, as health fair, food stalls, cookery demonstrations, and fashion shows where six Bangladeshi fashion houses will be sending over 80 outfits. Along with tourism information, every evening there will be two performances of a very special village-style opera called Jatra, never before performed in the West.

"With so much effort not to mention the fun and laughter, it will be a pity if Bangladeshis do not participate or show enough enthusiasm".

"Residing in London for the last 15 years, I am more Bangladeshi than the people living here," concludes Ali, smiling sadly.

DUTA condemns Apr 30 incident

Leaders of the Dhaka University Teachers' Association condemned Saturday the baton charges on striking teachers of non-government schools and colleges by police on April 30 last

Professor Mohammad Shahadat Ali and Dr Arefeen Siddique, president and general secretary of the association respectively in a statement protested the incident and said, such police action against the teachers had reminded them of the repression during the autocratic rule in the past.

They termed the measures taken by the Education Ministry to solve the crisis arising out of the strike as "conspiracy" to make division among the teachers. "It is not democratic, nor a reflection of effective management", they added.

Expressing anxiety over the situation of SSC examination they said it would be a farce like the examinations held in 1985 during the Ershad regime.


