# DMFA Cup Round 2 from today

The second rou nd of the third

DMFA Cup foot ball tournament begins today ami dst utter chaes and confusion with holders Mohammedan Sporting locked in a raging row with organisers Dhaka Metropolis

Football Association (DMFA). Brothers Union take on Vic toria Sporting Club in the first match scheduled for a 5 pm start while last year's runnersup Abahani Krira Chakra take on unfancied Farashganj in day's second encounter from 7 pm at the Dhaka Stadium.

However, the charm and the spirit of the meet has been considerably diminished by the seeming uncertainty over Mohammedans' participation.

One of the two most popular clubs besides Abahani, Mohammedans had earlier pleaded with the DMFA for a deferment of the second round on grounds of inadequate preparatory time for the meet.

Originally seeking a 21-day lay-off Mohammedans, who now seem to be engaged in a ego clash with the organisers, have of late been advocating for a token change if need be, just for a day.

 The DMFA has so far stuck to its gun reiterating its inabil-

obvious reasons. Antagonism bordered on indecency surfaced yesterday as the DMFA and Mohammedans expressed their intentions of not moving an inch from their respective stances, overruling the mediating efforts of the Dhaka Metropolis Clubs Association (DMCA), which tried to reconcile the warring parties during its annual meeting at the NSC conference room. Fazlur Rahman, secretary of the newly elected executive committee of Mohammedan Sporting Club told The Daily Star "We have swallowed our pride to request the DMFA to push back the meet by four days only. But they are obstinate and under the circumstances we cannot play." In a press release issued on Wednesday night Mohammedans had forwarded a prayer for four-day deferment to the DMFA following a verbal request in a meeting of the league committee held on

DMFA, which has proved unflinching so far in the face of a boycott threat by one of the most popular clubs (MSC), completed their part of formality by issuing a press release apprising its inability to put off the meet even by a day. The beleaguered organisers have their reasons for

Meanwhile, Abahani Krira Chakra, one of the heavy weights of the Dhaka football, have already made it known that they would not participate if DMFA buckles under Mohammedans' pressure, more specifically if any change is brought in the schedule after the opening day of the second round. Abahani did not take part in the first DMFA Cup.

Abahani are not the only club to exert the counter pressure on the organisers for an unchanged schedule. Other clubs, too, as some of the offictals said, are keen on a timely completion of the meet, categerically playing down Mohammedans' appeal for change in dates

However, the meet seems destined for a disruption though not because of any request from any of the participating clubs. The National Sports Council, the highest governing body for country's sports which owns the stadium, has informed the organisers of its decision to repair the floodlight towers from May 8. With the NSC's decision likely to overrule every other consideration, the DMFA may be forced into a change of mino against its will.



BUENOS AIRES, May 5: Diego Maradona hopes . to start training with Argentina's national squad within a matter of days, as he bids to win a place in the World Cup finals, reports AFP.

Maradona has been training alone for the past month at a sports centre 200kms from here, in a battle to reach match fitness.

But he said on Wednesday: "The doubts that I may have had once have subsided as my physical condition improves."

Maradona, who guided Argentina to World Cup victory in 1986 and to the 1990 final met with national coach Alfio Basile on Wednesday to discuss his training schedule.

Argentina are due to play the Kirin Cup tournament in Japan from May 16.

Maradona, who had previously announced his international retirement, returned to the national team for their 3-1 victory over Morocco in a friendly at Salta, Argentina on April 20.

MARSEILLE, May 5: Veteran striker Rudi Voeller said today, after a meeting with German team ohief Berti Vogts, that he would probably join his country's squad for June's World Cup finals, reports Reuter.

Voeller, 34, met Vogts after Marseille's French Cup defeat to Montpellier on Wednesday and they discussed the possibility of the striker returning to the national team.


"My comeback is now looking highly probable." Voeller said. "There are just a few details to work out."

two for 30 in his eight overs. removed Sajid Hassan quickly to reduce Acme to 19 for two in 6.3 overs. National all-rounder Aminul


