Pakistan on 'terrorist list' WASHINGTON, May 17: The

United States may soon put Pakistan on the list of countries it deems to be backing international terrorism, State Department spokesman Michael McCurry said Monday, reports AFP. "The activity that we are

aware of in support of Kashmiri militants is something that we monitor, and if that were in the category of repeated instances of state sponsorship of terrorism, that could lead to a different determination on the status of US policy toward Pakistan," the spokesman said.

"The Pakistani government is aware that any state supporting terrorism might be put on the list, which would result in restrictions on bilateral diplomatic and trade ties," he said.

Clinton-Rao talks tomorrow

WASHINGTON, May 17: US media say Kashmir will be on the agenda of the Clinton-Narasimha Rao talks here on may 19, reports PTI.

It is not clear whether President Clinton will raise the issue or Premier Rao, who on the basis of the finding of the State Department in the report on global terrorism and the Washington Post despatch, will be fully justified to say that the US was not following its own laws by refusing to brand Pakistan as a state sponsor of terrorism.

However, according to a senior official, the last thing that will happen is the raising of controversial issues by either


