

#### Pringle stifles England before Stewart became too team after skipping the West



first one-day international at Edgbaston, reports AP. Pringle's fast-medium pace delivery had plenty of movement as he bettered his previous figures of four wickets in a one-day international against

England during the 1990-91 Captain Mike Atherton scored 81 before he was run out by Martin Crowe while trying to make a single off a

stroke by Graeme Hick.

New Zealand won the toss and elected to take the field in windy, overcast conditions. Captain Ken Rutherfored opted for fast-medium pacers Danny Morrison and Chris Pringle to open the bowling attack against Atherton and Alec Stewart.

Stewart and Atherton raced to 28 from the first five overs

Stewart tried to pull a short ball from Pringle to the boundary, but Dion Nash was there to take an easy catch at long leg. Stewart was out for 24, with England at 33 for one.

The English thrust slowed as medium-pacer Dion Nash replaced Morrison, but it was a spinner who claimed the next wicket at 84.

Robin Smith was caught behind on 15 by wicketkeeper Adam Parore. Smith was trying to slice a Shane Thomson delivery during Thomson's second over.

England reached 100 in the 28th over, and Atherton reached his fifth in the next over with a single on his 89th

Morrison, who has been bothered by a groin injury during the tour, was replaced after he began limping noticeably just before lunch. Mark Greatbatch came on as the 12th man.

England's fortunes faltered after the break. Former captain Graham Gooch, back in the

Thomson's delivery brushed his pads and hit the off-stump. England, at 140 for three. then lost four more wickets in the next 15 overs.

#### Barcelona blown away AC Milan simply awesome



AC Milan found the way back to champagne soccer on Wednesday night, humi-

liating Barcelona in a crushing 4-0 win to lift the European Cup, reports Reuter.

Two first half goals from Daniele Massaro and two early in the second period from Dejan Savicevic and Marcel Desailly sealed the issue in a majestic team performance unmatched in many a year at Europe's usually disappointing annual soccer showpiece.

Milan confounded all expectations. Their defensive approach in the Italian league this season had led the soccer world to suspect they had forgotten the delightful, flowing style which was once their trademark.

Not so, as 30,000 ecstatic Milan fans in the 75,000 crowd at Athens' Olympic Stadium witnessed. The Italians became only the second team in 20 years to score four goals in the European Cup final as they took the trophy for the

third time in six seasons. The last was Milan themselves, 4-0 winners over Steaua Bucharst in 1989. though this time they were playing a team of far superior

quality. But Johan Cruyff's usually adventurous Barcelona found themselves helpless spectators at the Milan Festival, deprived of space and any chance to play their attacking socces by the Italian team's brilliant organi-

sation.

Milan's hero was the erratic Savicevic. Without the suspended Franco Baresi and injured Marco van Basten, it seemed unlikely Milan could find their old panache but the Motenegrin stepped into the void with a vengeance.

It was his devastating run down the right and into the box which set up the first goal after 22 minutes. Closing-fast on goal, Savicevic chose not to take the obvious option of shooting, scooping the ball instead over keeper Andoni Zubizarreta for Massaro to supply the final touch.

Barcelona were exposed in a similar way on the other flank just before halftime when Roberto Donadoni wriggled his way through to lay off perfectly for Massaro to blast home with a flerce left foot shot.

Barcelona, struggling to get their game together until then, looked dead when the whistle went for the break. Thirteen minutes into the second period they were buried.

Savicevic, a soccer genius who will sadly not be at the World Cup finals starting in less than a month, scored a stunningly outrageous goal two

defender's head and then casually lobbed over Zubizarreta's head from a seemingly impossible position wide on the right and outside the area.

Milan started to look contemptuous of the opposition as they add a fourth in the 58th minute Demaetrio Albertini slipping through for Frenchman Desailly to run clear and

Desailly, a tower of strength in the Italian midfield, was in the Marseille side which beat Milan in last year's final.

cessive league titles but this was his first European trophy and it followed three Cup final disappointments, last year's European Super Cup. Milan lifted the European

Cup for the fifth time and are now just one short of Real Madrid's record. It was the eighth win by an Italian club.

A hugely disappointing Barcelona looked badly jaded after a long fight to win their fourth successive Spanish league title, a battle which ended only four days ago.

Milan, by contrast, looked fresh after sealing their league title well before the end of the Italian season.

#### No alcohol please!

PASADENA, May 19: Alcohol sales and consumption were banned Wednesday in most ar eas of the Rose Bowl for World Cup matches, and restaurateurs were asked to curtail alcohol sales during games, reports AP.

"We decided that alcohol would be allowed in designated hospitality areas in the licensed premises, which are outside of the stadium," said Edmund Sotelo, assistant city manager. The areas include executive and private suites.

"We have no jurisdiction in compelling restaurants to restrict the sale of alcohol. But we are urging them to voluntarily restrict it two hours before a game and two hours after a game.

Eight World Cup games, including the championship, will be played at the Rose Bowl between June 17 and July 17.

In taking the action, city officials noted that violence and property damage have occurred at international games. with alcohol blamed for the rampages.

During previous World Cup tournaments, host cities have banned the sale of alcohol for up to 24 hours before a match. But the Pasadena City Council rejected such a measure.

Many restaurant and bar owners had opposed a citywide ban on alcohol sales.

The city plans to add police foot patrols in the Old Town area, which is home to most of Pasadena's restaurants and

Undercover Alcohol Beverage Commission personnel will be in Pasadena throughout the tournament to make sure every patron being served alcohol is 21, the legal drinking age.

#### Indonesia in Thomas Cup final

JAKARTA, May 19: Favourites Indonesia stormed into the Thomas Cup badminton final with a 4-1 victory over South Korea on Wednesday, setting up the prospect of an epic clash with defending champions Malaysia.

Malaysia reached the final on Tuesday when they beat China 4-1 in the first semifinal

contest. In the women's Uber Cup. defending champions China qualified for their sixth consecutive final by defeating Sweden 3-2 and will meet Indonesia, whose only Uber Cup success was in 1975, on Friday

#### Chile hold Argentina

SANTIAGO, Chile, May 19: Veteran defender Oscar Ruggeri headed an 83rd minute equaliser to give World Cup qualifiers Argentina a 3-3 draw with Chile on Wednesday in a friendly which gave Argentine fans plenty to worry about, reports Reuter.

The 1990 World Cup runners-up, whose recent performances have been heavily criticised, looked uncertain in defence and were of ten lacklustre in midfield as they came perilously close to a rare defeat. against their neighbours and old rivals.

Diego · Maradona set up Argentina's second goal for Abel Balbo with a splendid 30metre pass and took the corner which led to Ruggeri's equaliser. Maradona was substituted five minutes from

Ruggeri's goal saved what had otherwise been a disappointing personal performance.

Maradona, without a club since being sacked by Newell's Old Boys in February and struggling to shed excess weight in time for the next month's World Cup finals, said afterwards he was "tired but happy to have stood it for so long."

#### Bolivar want Maradona


