650 tonnes of wheat seeds produced.

May 24: Some 650 metric ton's high yielding variety wheat seeds and 625 metric tons paddy seeds have been produced in contract growers zone of BADC of Jamalpur district during the current season, reports UNB.

According to official sources, with these seeds at least 10,666 acres of land will be brought under wheat and about 20,000 acres of land under paddy cultivation during the next season.

The sources also said some 1.266 contract farmers in seven blocks have been producing the seeds every year during the monsoon.
