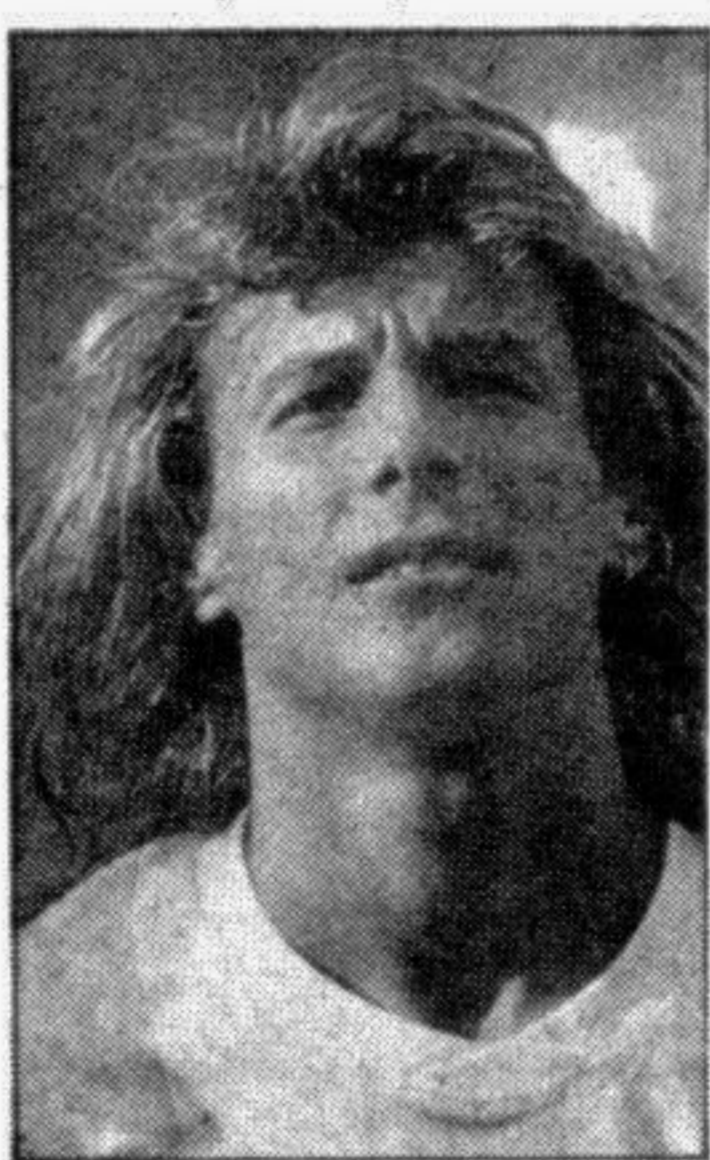

The doctor said he was impressed with the physical progress Diego Maradona has made since the squad arrived at the Babson College outside Boston where they have made their World Cup base.

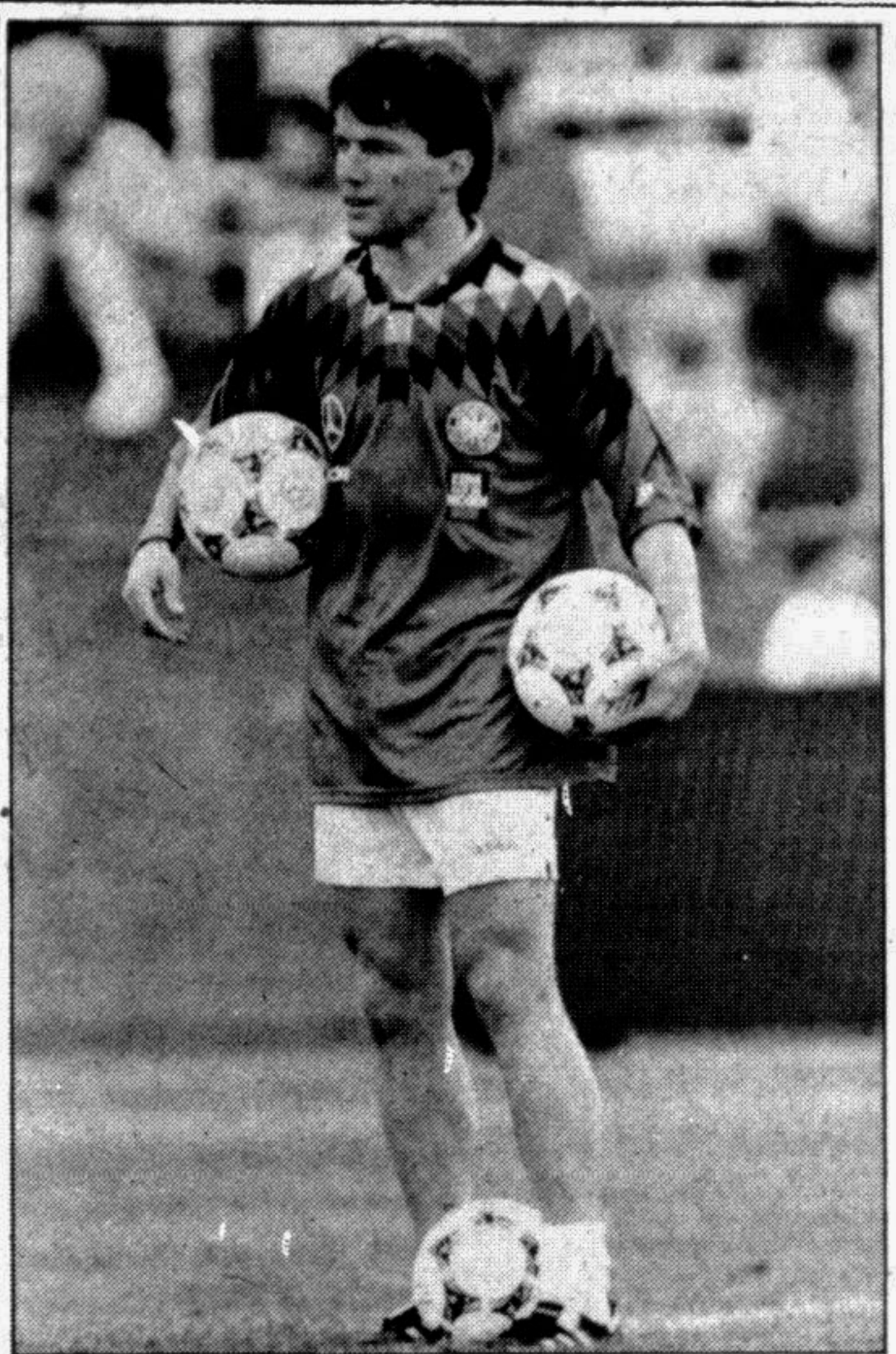


CLAUDIO CANNIGGIA worried. When he feels less pain I hope to start work on his leg, possible the day after tomorrow.
