### Colombian coach decides to quit

FULLERTON, California, June 23: Colombia coach Francisco Maturana, whose team are effectively out of the World Cup after two disastrous games, will quit after their final first round match, the squad spokesman said on Thursday, reports Reuter.

"The coach has told the Colombian FA that he will quit his job after the first round has ended," spokesman Antonio Correa told Reuters.

### A thermal World Cup

LOS ANGELES, June 23: Italian coach Arrigo Sacchi says two World Cups are being played, one on the east coast and one on the west coast of the United States, reports AFP.

"No doubt there are different weather conditions along the two coasts," he said. "Romania, Cameroon and Sweden could show a faster football because they did not play in heat and humidity, on the other coast, teams used to quick moves had to slow down their pace."

Sacchi was quick to add he was not using the heat at Giants Stadium near New York as an excuse for Italy's 1-0 loss to Ireland, since Italian players are more used to hot weather.

Heat and humidity are playing a role at Giants Stadium the Citrus Bowl in Orlando, Florida, RPK Stadium at Washington, Dallas' Cotton Bowl and the Silverdome in Detroit.

### For Gomez it's over

PASADENA, June 23: Midfielder Gabriel Gomez was forced out of Colombia's crucial World Cup Group A match against the United States on Wednesday after a death threat was apparently made against his family, reports Reuter.

"There is no way I can play football under this pressure," Gomez said on television just 45 minutes before the kick-off.

"My football career is as good as over," said Gomez, whose brother Hernan Dario is an assistant to Colombian team coach Francisco Maturana.

Colombian journalists travelling with the team said Maturana had threatened to resign rather than make the change but had finally agreed after frantic negotiations with the Colombian Football Federation.

"It took a lot of negotiation to persuade Maturana not to resign and to stay," said one reporter.

Colombian team officials were unavailable immediately to comment on the media reports.

Gomez, 25, earned his 50th cap in Colombia's opening 3-1 defeat against Romania on Saturday and, until two hours before Wednesday's kick-off, as due to play against the Americans.

He had been blamed by some after Saturday's match for failing to mark Romania's Gheorghe Hagi adequately.

Various sources said he and Maturana had received threats at their Los Angeles base from an unidentified group in Medellin that they would bomb their families' houses in Colombia if Gomez played.

It was not immediately clear how the threats were made.

Hernan Dario Gomez also received death threats two years ago while with the Colombian team.

Colombian journalists said the group had demanded Herman Gaviria, a 24-year-old who plays for Medellin club Atletico Nacional, take Gomez' place.

Gaviria was named in the starting line-up.

Colombia's build-up to the match was fraught with problems. On Sunday the brother of defender Luis Herrera was killed in a car crash in Bogota, but Herrera opted to play.

### All's well on WC front

WASHINGTON, June 23: A trouble free first week has proved both a relief and a surprise for the American World Cup authorities, reports AFP.

"The crowds have been very loud and very enthusiastic but there haven't been that many situations we have had to defend," said Washington's deputy police chief, Melvin Clark.

### Sadeq's hattrick powers Dhaka

National player Mohammed Sadeq scored a hattrick as his side Dhaka District stormed into the semi-final of the Ragbi All Gold Cup hockey tournament with a thumping 4-0 win over Bangladesh Air Force at the Hockey Stadium yesterday.

Dhaka will meet Faridpur in the first semifinal on Saturday.

### Zia stunned

International Master Ziaur Rahman of Biman suffered a jolt in the thirteenth round of the 20th national chess when he was held to a draw by unheralded Tayebur Rahman of Khulna at the chess room of National Sports Council yesterday.

### Reward of five years' rigour

DALLAS, June 23: African soccer touched new heights with Nigeria's 3-0 World Cup victory over Bulgaria in their opening match, and it is thanks largely to the hard work of two Dutch coaches, reports Reuter.

Nigeria became only the second black African side after Cameroon to beat European opposition at the World Cup as a result of combining African flair and talent with European discipline and tactics.

Chief coach Clemens Westerhof had every reason to be ecstatic at his team's crushing win on their World Cup debut after five years of toil to turn exceptional raw talent into an exciting new force on the world stage.

"We came to show what Africa could do, and we've proved that Africans can play World Cup winning football," Westerhof said after Tuesday's win.

"It's been one of our major aims to entertain and I think we put on a really good show."

But the route to Tuesday's historic win has been tough.

"These five years have cost me 10 years of my life," said Westerhof. His assistant Jo Bonfrere recalls with amusement his first encounter with the squad some four years ago.

Westerhof told him to take a coaching session.

"After about one and a half hours we finished and I went back inside and saw Westerhof. Bonfrere said, 'He asked what I thought and I said, 'They were fine, but when do I get to work with the first team?'"

"He looked at me and said, 'that is the first team' I was more than surprised."

But Bonfrere was as convinced as Westerhof that European discipline could produce potential world-beaters.

"They are so skilful with the ball," he said, "I was not a bad player but I had to hide my face in shame when I saw some of the things they could do. What they can do with the ball is unbelievable."

The men have spent hours trying to blend hard-working European mentality with naturally gifted talent.

That paid dividends in April in Tunisia when Nigeria won the African Nations' Cup for the first time since 1980.

"That was not the easiest job we had to do because they are used to playing as individuals. But in the past four years we succeeded in bringing them together," said Bonfrere.

"But for the World Cup we had to do something extra with them, and that's what we have been doing in the last few weeks, to push them, even with

punishment, to make them play as a team."

"We have worked very hard with them and tried to instil a European way of playing on them. We used the African techniques and put it into a team set-up."

"We did not have to teach them how to control a soccer ball, they already have that. So we worked day and night ... to make a team," he said.

"The talent of the European team player is in the mind."

"And we have worked for four years to give them the mentality of the European player," he added. "We have done that ... I don't think we will be going out of this tournament quickly."

One aspect of European mentality they drilled into players is to fight for the ball and try to win it back in midfield. Another key to Nigeria's success has been the number of players in Europe — Westerhof helped them find clubs.

Seventeen of his 22-man squad are with European clubs and another with the African club champions, Zamalek of Egypt.

The experience of playing against top European players and in the European Cup competitions has been invaluable in educating the Nigerians about what to expect at the World Cup.

### Edberg exits

WIMBLEDON, June 23: Stefan Edberg became the third former champion knocked out in the early rounds of Wimbledon, losing Thursday in five sets as 113th-ranked Kenneth Carlsen of Denmark played the match of his life, reports AP.

It was the worst Wimbledon showing for the third-seeded Edberg since another second-round loss back in 1984. He had reached at least the quarterfinals every year since 1987, winning the title in 1988 and 1990.

Aranxa Sanchez Vicario and Jana Novotna, two of the women's favourites after Graf's ouster, easily won second-round matches Thursday.

### MSC off to a stuttering start

Mohammedan Sporting Club made an unimpressive but winning start in the BEXIMCO 12th Federation Cup football tournament when they edged past Wari Club by the odd goal in three at the Dhaka Stadium yesterday.

In the other match of the day, Muktiyodha Sangsad KC had a disappointing second round opener when they were held by Fakirpool YMC 1-1 in a lackluster encounter.

Mizan put Muktiyodha into the lead in the seventh minute while Asif restored parity for Fakirpool.
