

It is a privilege for Bangladesh to host such a prestigious event, which also indicates the confidence of the Asian Billiards and Snooker Federation in our Natioal Association.


I express my hearty thanks to the Bangladesh Billiards and Snooker Federation in hosting this important Asian tournament in the country.

### ASIAN SNOOKER COMES TO TOWN

Star Report

The eleventh Asian Snooker Championship begins in the city today.

Industries Minister AM Zahiruddin Khan will formally inaugurate the 12-nation, nine-day meet at seven this evening.

Competition proper, however, will commence from tomorrow morning, Play will be held in four three-hour sessions daily until July 6, starting at ten every morning. The closing ceremony is billed for July 7.

The participating countries are China, Chinese Taipei, Singapore, Malayasia, Brunei. Thailand, the Philippines, India, Pakistan Hong Kong, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh.

The ballroom of the Dhaka Sheraton has been converted into a fitting venue for this premier continental snooker meet. Four tables have been set up and a gallery to accommodate nearly a hundred spectators.

The champion will collect a purse of 1250 dollars out of the total prize money of 2750 dollars. The runner-up will get 700 dollars, the third finisher 500 dollars and the other losing semifinalist 250 dollars.
