KISHOREGANJ, June 29: A total of about two lakh sixty four thousand three hundred hectares of land will be brought under the Aus paddy cultivation under intensive farming programme during the current summer season in five districts of Mymensingh Agrieultural Zone (MAZ), officials sources said.

The districts are : My mensingh, Jamalpur, Sherpur Netrakona and Kishoregani.

Additional Director of Agriculture Extension Department Mymensingh, Paresh Chandra Das said, the 1.32,300 hectares under the different of High Yielding Varieties (HYV) Aus and the 1,32,000 hectares under the different varieties of local Aus.

He also said that under the programme, the target of aus paddy production has been fixed at 3,96,600 metric tons in these districts. It includes, 2,64,600 metric tons from the different high yielding vari eties and 1.32,000 metric tons from the different local varieties of aus paddy during the current season

Of the total, 1,38,000

hectares will be cultivated in

Mymensingh district, 16,000

hectares in Jamalpur. 23,000 hectares in Sherpur, 50,300 hectares in Netrakona and 37.000 hectares in Kishoreganj districts. Necessary measures were

being taken to ensure supply of different Agri inputs to the farmers, the source informed.

The sufficient amount of money had already been sanc tioned by the government for distribution as loan among the farmers of these districts for successful implementation of the programme.

Besides. Agricultural Ex tension Department has selected 222 demonstration plots in 5 districts to teach the farmers modern scientific methods of aus cultivation.

Jaundice takes serious turn in Moulvibazar

MOULVIBAZAR, June 29: Jaundice is spreading alarm ingly in all the six thanas of Moulvibazar district.

In the district headquarters and adjacent areas the disease has taken a serious turn and members of almost all the families have been attacked by the disease.

Dr Hemanta Das. Medical Officer of Moulvibazar Sadar Hospital told this correspondent, there is no need of any medicine for the jaundice. But the patient will have normal food, drink boiled water and have complete physical rest. It is fatal if not timely treated, Dr Das added.

Dr. Jillul Hoque, Medical officer of the office of the civil surgeon Moulvibazar when contacted advise the patients to take water of coconut, juice of sugarcane an other fruits.

He explained that 'glucose' is the most important diet for recovery from jaundice. According to his advice, glucose flourishing food items are essential to the jaundice pa-

Dr Md Abdul Malek M B Bs. a private practitioner of the town informed that primary symptom of the disease was the yellowish of colour of the urine, the eyes and some times the whole body. The patient of jaundice would initially have temperature and headache and start feeling weak with vomiting tendency. Patients suffering from jaundice are pouring to the chamber of doctors, hospitals and rural health complexes. Usually the doctor did not prescribe any medicine but series of advice. The disappointed patients then take shelter at the rural kaviraj (physician of herbal medicine) for herbal treatment. Educated patients usually take shelter at homeo-

pathic physicians. A homeopath physician of the town claimed that only homeopathic treatment has medicine for jaundice and any type of jaundice patient can recover from jaundice by taking homeopath medicine.

Prices of all kinds of essen tial commodities have gone up in the local markets abnormally causing hardship to the general consumers particularly to the low income group of people and the farmers who

were affected by the low price

of agricultural products. Prices of sugar, pulses, fish, meat and edible and have registered a sharp rise causing sufferings to the common people. Mosur pulse now sells at Taka-28 per kg. and Kheshari which is mostly consumed by the low income group of people is now being sold at Taka 26 per kg. as against taka-24

per kg. a week ago. Due to short supply price of fish and meat have registered rise. Prices of eggs and milk have also gone up. The high price of edible oil is causing anxiety to the low income group of people. Pure and unadulterated mustered and soyabean oil are hardly available. It may be pointed out here that most the people of Chuadanga district have been suffering from various intestinal disease due to consumption of adulterated mustard and soyabean oil which are now being sold at Taka-48 and 56 per kg. respectively.

This is going on without any check and resistance from any quarter what-soever. It has become a common and regular feature of this town now a days. The adulterated food stuff are posing a great danger to the public health.

Ghee, mustered oil, coconut oil, dalda, milk, sweetmeats and soyabean oils etc all are adulterated with chemical reactionaries respectively. Pure varieties of all these items are not practically available anywhere in the district.

Even a gram of pure variety of mustard oil, soyabean and coconut oil of which the prices have registered an abnormal rise cannot be traced and pro-

It is apprehended that due to the consumption of adulterated foodstuff particularly ghee, dalda mustard oil, soyabean and sweetmeats various kinds of intestinal diseases are breaking out in the district. The abnormal price rise of the various items of daily essentials is believed to be the main reason this is giving impetus to the dishonest traders in adulteration.

So far milk is concerned. either water is mixed with pure milk or milk is prepared with lower categories of powder milk and those are selling in the open market freely.

Minister visits power plant


