### An Obsession with Streets

Our peoples' deep-rooted love for streets is not unknown to anyone. Here people take to the street *en masse* for making themselves heard, wage a protest or demonstrate against almost anything and every thing under the sun. Historically, streets have always played a vital role in all our political struggles. Street processions had probably been one of the most powerful forms of democratic protest not in our country alone, but in almost all the countries of the world.

During the British and the Pakistani rule of our land, people took to the street to protest and fight against common and identified enemies. So, this form of protest then had a tremendous amount of strength encapsulated within, which eventually led to the dismantling of the foreign domination in our country. At first, the rallies and processions that took

imagination, which led some viewers into a mad drive for hero-worshipping. That people could come out *en masse* to protest the death sentence looming on a fictitious character of a TV drama is really the rarest of the rare incidents that take place only once in a blue moon.

The latest inclusion in this regard is the street protests staged in many cities of the country against FIFA's decision to expel the Argentine football legend Diego Maradona from the World Cup on drug charges. True, that Maradona has been a phenomenal name in world soccer for the last decade or so. He has also made football a little more popular than what it was before. "Surely, this is a rare quality of a sportsman who can revolutionise the sport itself. Diego is one of the gifted footballers the world has ever seen. But still, people over here seem to be doing a little in excess," says a foot-



place in streets were exclusively political in nature. But nowadays, in the changed circumstances, streets have become a venue for any kind of protests — be it political or cultural, national or international.

The Bangalee people, who are known for their instinct-driven mental make-up and their ever readiness to react on a whim — a national trait that can probably be only comparable to the typical Irish sensitivity, have always taken recourse to the street protests in an hour of desperation or frenzy. But lately, it seems that this 'street thing' has been stretched a little more than what is necessary or even decent.

Who could forget the frenzied viewers of a popular TV serial coming out in the street to protest the execution of the protagonist of the serial, Baker Bhai? An anti-social element was rapidly transformed into a hero of an enduring height by the sheer virtue of the playwright's

ball connoisseur who sees no point in such exaggeration as he fails to understand, "How can we expect that making a public protest from half way across the world, we can deliver our message to the FIFA officials? It's all very typical of the excesses that we have become habituated to." Now that the Argentine team is out of the tournament, the anger over Maradona's expulsion seemed to have mellowed down a little. But still, there are plenty who firmly believe that if the 'soccer maestro' was there, things would have been a whole lot different for Argentina.

As the city streets are increasingly being occupied for rallies and processions of lesser national importance or, in some cases, no importance at all, probably someday people will have to think of wind-gliding or hand-gliding as the only mode of transport from one place of the city to the other.

## DU media centre to be set up by November

The Department of Mass Communication and Journalism of the Dhaka University is going to install a Tk 1.2 crore media centre by November this year to familiarise the students with latest print and audio-visual media equipment.

This will add a new dimension in the study of mass communication and journalism in the country," the department Chairman Dr A A M S Arefin Siddique said while talking to this correspondent.

The Asia Foundation and the USAID have jointly funded about Tk 72 lakh while the rest will be provided by the Bangladesh government.

The department chairman hoped that the students may begin using the centre from January next year.

"It is actually a communications laboratory in which the students will gain practical experience in print and electronic journalism," Dr Siddique said adding that the laboratory would have three units — desk top publishing unit, audio-visual unit and still photography and dark room unit.

The media centre will help the students, specially in post graduate level

to get technical training in editing, advertisement, mass communication, communication planning, video production etc.

The department chairman further added that they were thinking of introducing short courses on DTP, video produc-

tion and others for the general public in future so that the media centre could also provide training facilities for the interested individuals.

The laboratory will have desk top computers with multi-media use options, power PCs with colour display monitors, video graphics equipments, video editing console, portable colour video monitors, video editing panels, digital special effects, still camera with all other accessories, photo printing and dark room equipment and related books.

Besides, the university authorities have sanctioned a room in the Lecture Theatre building for installing the equipment.

Dr Siddique, however, felt that the space given initially was not enough for this laboratory. He added that the department had sought more space from the university authorities.
