

## Dhaka Day by Day In Black and White

Everything about Jahanara Imam is in black and white. Her childhood, her youth, her family and her struggle, all penned down accurately to minute details.

Her books, *Anno Jiban* (an autobiography), *Ektattur Din Gooli* (Of Blood and Fire), *Cancerer Shathe Basabas* (Living with Cancer), and the on-going photographic exhibition, where every phase of her life and work is in pictures, only give a clear image of a woman who accepted life in her strides. She was the only personality who never thought it necessary to hide what went through her head or what she decided to do. She was exactly like a solitaire diamond, brilliant, pure, hard and preciously transparent.

"In memory of Shaheed Jahanara Imam (she was known to be so to many), her struggle and fight against the conspirators and enemies of our great war of liberation Ektattur Jatree (voyagers '71) has arranged for this first ever photographic display on a single personality," says Akku Chowdhury, General Secretary of the organisation.

This display is featuring her photos taken over the period of her life time. "Starting from 11 years till her death, we have collected about 200 pictures from different photo journalists," he confirms. "As is the motto of Ektattur Jatree, to create awareness, among the

younger generation about the sacrifice and gift of the nation's great heroes, we have organized this unique show to let the people know what she was and what she became," Akku Chowdhury reflects on the theme. This show has a collection of photographs taken during her three years struggle. These unique pictures were the works of Rashid Talukder, Dr Shahidul Alam, Pavel Rahman, Shamsul Haque Tinku among others.

"Amma, as we call Jahanara Imam, was not only a mother she was our mentor as well," recalls a freedom fighter emotionally. "We have experienced or rather created an unusual event, we liberated our country. But unfortunately when we returned to Dhaka, we were treated as nobodies. From kings, who decided their own and others fate, we became simple street boys. No one recognised us let alone thank us," he continues.

"It is at this time that we became frustrated and insulted, some of us became outlaws and spott. Because when a 16-year old faces blood, fire, kills people his mental state goes through a series of traumas. He needs reward and compassion but it is a cruel truth that all he got was frustration," he recalls the pain. "It was during this time that Amma talked and helped us out of these complexes. At the same time she overcame her pains to prepare for the struggles," he says.

"Before the war, we saw her as a glamorous woman, during the war as a smart and courageous one but it was after the war that we were in her spell," he explains. "She has again rekindled the fire and dynamism of the spirit of liberation, which was slowly diminishing," says Akku Chowdhury. This show was arranged within three weeks immediately after her death "to create an impact," says Chowdhury. Ektattur Jatree is an organization built as one of her arms and it support her cause, earnestly. As a second phase of this show, the organisation will arrange only a posters and leaflets show around September. "It will be on the posters and leaflets published so far, on the works as the Nirmul Committee," he says.

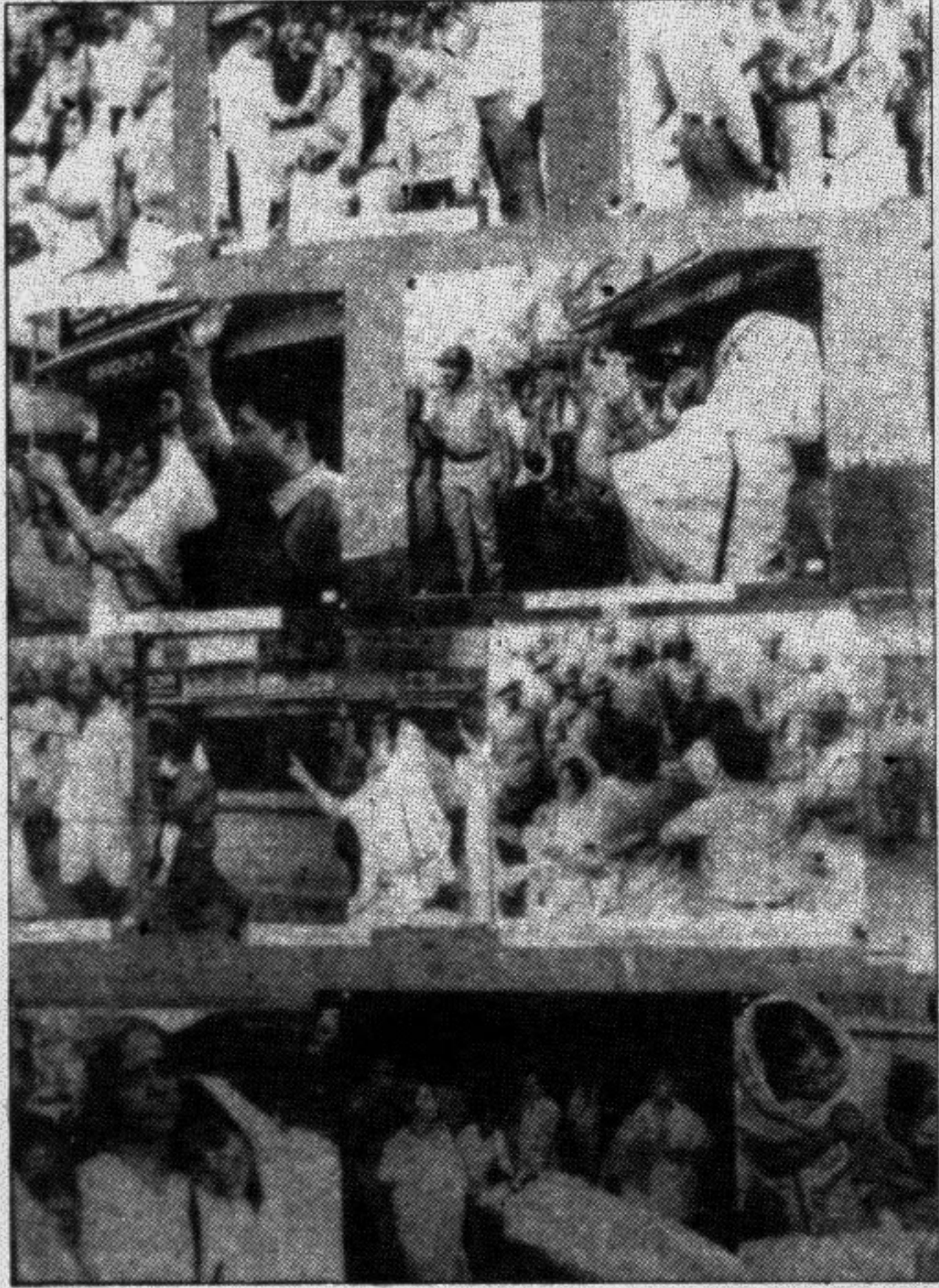
Her own reflections and sayings about the Nirmul Committee clarify and accept the serious mistake done by the country's citizens. "It is our fault, I am also to be blame. Me and many other Shaheed mothers, we couldn't keep our sons united." This was what Jahanara Imam said on March 2, 1992, in a rally of Nirmul Committee in Demra. May be, in her mind, she was trying to answer for the delay. But in her last appeal and directive to the people of Bangladesh she wrote "... As a nation the unity and courage of the Bangladeshis have been without parallel. ... You stand united and fight to the very end.

Even though I will not be among to you, I will know that you — my millions of Bengalee children — will live in a free Golden Bengal with your sons and daughters ... surely, victory will be ours." Even till the last moments she wrote down her wishes. This accurate and systematic approach towards her life was what commanded so much love and respect.

*Anno Jiban* is about her childhood and courtship and in its last page she said that she would not do politics but settle down to a family life. Her *Ektattur Din Gooli* is about her sons, their participation in the war and her marriage and in the end the death of her husband. Living with Cancer is about her fight against death, chronologically she has written down all the ups and downs of her life.

Jahanara Imam, an epitome of elegance, perseverance, led a life which was a mixture of dramatic and romantic ideals. Her writings and photographs mark an important part of the history of our independence war.

The independence war was not a political issue, though theoretically it is the highest political mark, it is and always will be a sacred issue. No distortions or make believe stories can be spun out of it. It is only here that Jahanara Imam's contribution to the war stands as a wall between the true and the fabricated ones.

Hanif said after 23 years of independence "We should not criticize Jamaat for their present role. But we will have to take into account what it had done during the war of independence. Prof Golam Azam should not be our main issue. At this moment, our main objective should be how to implement the ideals of our great leader Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman."

He urged the freedom fighters to let their sons learn the true history of the liberation war of the country.

City Mayor Alhaj Mahiuddin Chowdhury called upon all to fight against communalism and fascism in order to build a non-communal and exploitation free society.

Later Mayor Hanif distributed stipends among 65 sons and dependents of the freedom fighters.

## UNB chief off to Delhi

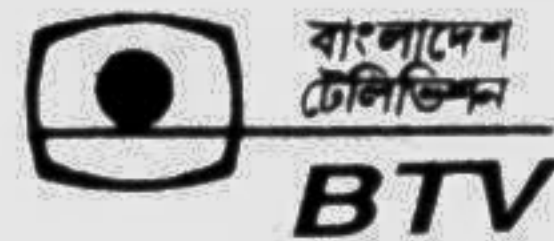
## Mosharraf urges Poles to invest in Bangladesh
