## Saudi daily praises Bangladesh economy

The 'international basket-case' of the seventies today has its sea ports packed with Bangladeshi rice, being exported and all rising economic indicators point towards the long-awaited goals, a Saudi Arabian daily newspaper has said, reports BSS.

The Riyadh Daily of Saudi Arabia in a recent article said, 'Begum Khaleda Zia's administration seems to have struck what the previous governments had miserably failed to. A Bangladesh of today, it seems, is determined to shun the past deprivation and penury,' it observed.

Meanwhile, Bangladesh ambassador to Saudi Arabia Chaudhury Mohammad Saifi Sami in an interview with the Riyadh Daily said the economy of Bangladesh has recorded a very significant improvement over the last three years.

Referring to the adverse impact of the Farakka dam, he said, 'it has become nightmare for our country.'

Speaking on the Saudi-Bangladesh economic cooperation, Sami said Bangladesh had been offered 915 million US dollars as assistance of which more than 70 per cent has been grant.
