**4 killed in road mishaps**

Four people including a minor girl were killed in separate road accidents while another girl committed suicide in the city yesterday.

Taslima, a ten-year-old girl, was knocked down by a speeding auto-rickshaw at Kawan Bazar around 1 pm while she was crossing the road.

The girl, daughter of one Fulmiah, was rushed to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) where she died immediately after her admission.

A garments factory worker, Anwara Begum, 30, was run over by a train at Tejgaon when she was going to her working place in the morning.

At Jatrabari, one 70-year-old Mohammad Abul Kasem was run over by a truck early in the morning.

At Mahakhali, Morshed, 60, died in a road accident while crossing the road.

A young girl Salma reportedly committed suicide by taking poison at Dakshin Khan Jatrabari.

The 20-year-old girl took poison Tuesday morning and died in the DMCH around noon yesterday.

The causes of her suicide was not known immediately.

All the five bodies were sent to the DMCH morgue for autopsy.

**Local initiatives for development sought**

President Abdur Rahman Biswas yesterday said local initiatives should be taken simultaneously with those of the government for development of respective areas, reports UNB.

Government has been endeavouring to develop all areas in a balanced manner to reach the benefits of democracy to the people, the President told a delegation of Kurigram Samity when they called on him at Bangabhaban.

The President said with the construction of Jamuna bridge, the development activities of the northern districts will get further impetus.

He assured the delegation that Kurigram would receive due share of the development efforts of the government like other districts.

Earlier, in a memorandum the delegation appealed to the President for full implementation of the Dharla barrage project, construction of a Bridge over Dharla river for improvement of communication in the area and setting up of a paper and pulp mill at Kurigram.

**Saudi daily praises Bangladesh economy**

The 'International basket-case' of the seventies today has its sea ports packed with Bangladeshi rice, being exported and all rising economic indicators point towards the long-awaited goals, a Saudi Arabian daily newspaper has said, reports BSS.

The Riyadh Daily of Saudi Arabia in a recent article said, 'Begum Khaleda Zia's administration seems to have struck what the previous governments had miserably failed to. A Bangladesh of today, it seems, is determined to shun the past deprivation and penury,' it observed.

Meanwhile, Bangladesh ambassador to Saudi Arabia Chaudhary Mohammad Sani in an interview with the Riyadh Daily said the economy of Bangladesh has recorded a very significant improvement over the last three years.

Referring to the adverse impact of the Farakka dam, he said, 'It has become nightmare for our country.'

Speaking on the Saudi-Bangladesh economic cooperation, Sani said Bangladesh had been offered 915 million US dollars as assistance of which more than 70 per cent has been grant.

**BNP govt firm to meet basic needs: Huda**
