### Warwickshire in trouble

LONDON, Aug 7: Leaders Warwickshire were in danger of their first county championship defeat of the season after an eight-hour innings of 180 by Worcestershire captain Tim Curtis put his team in command on Saturday, reports Reuter.

Curtis guided Worcestershire to 473 for four declared — a first innings lead of 257 — and then saw his new-ball pair snap up two key wickets in the final hour.

Phil Newport trapped Roger Twose lbw and Dominic Ostler went the same way against Neal Radford to leave Warwickshire on 56 for two at the close of the third day of the four-day match at Worcester.

Curtis, whose previous 22 first-class innings had yielded only 529 runs, batted painstakingly on a slow pitch to reach his century off 302 balls with seven fours.

The tempo was lifted by David Leatherdale and Stuart Lampitt during an unbroken fifth-wicket stand of 133 in 25 overs.

Leatherdale stroked 50 off 49 balls and finished unbeaten on 71, including seven fours and a six.

### Klinsmann on, Cantona off

LONDON, Aug 7: The German was mobbed by excited fans as he left the field. The Frenchman walked off alone, disgraced by yet another red card.

Juergen Klinsmann made his first appearance for Tottenham Saturday in a pre-season exhibition game at Division One Watford and was an instant hit with the Spurs followers, reports AP.

The German, scorer of five goals in the World Cup, didn't find the target this time in a 1-1 draw but did enough to make him a favourite among the 8,000 Tottenham fans crammed into Watford's modest 15,000 capacity stadium.

The two million pound German gave indications that his partnership with Teddy Sheringham would echo his success at international level alongside Rudi Voeller.

Klinsmann could easily have ended the day with a hat-trick. It took an inspired performance by Watford keeper Kevin Miller to deny the German, although Klinsmann himself was left shaking his head after one second-half miss.

Watford opened the scoring through former Spurs youth Richard Johnson in the 34th minute. Sheringham equalised with a header in the second half.

Eric Cantona, sent off twice towards the end of last season, saw red again Saturday. Only 90 seconds after he was shown the yellow card for dissent playing for Manchester United in a 1-0 exhibition loss at Glasgow Rangers, he was shown the red one for a two-footed lunge at the home team's Steven Pressley.

While Tottenham almost certainly have Klinsmann in their lineup for the opening game of the Premier League season at Sheffield Wednesday Aug 20.

### Russia, Croatia unbeaten

TORONTO, Aug 7: Olympic silver medalists Croatia and Russia completed preliminary round play at the 12th World Championship of basketball with perfect 3-0 records on Saturday, reports Reuter.

Dino Radja and Arijia Komazec each scored 25 points to lead Croatia past Australia 83-69 in Pool B play at Maple Leaf Gardens in Toronto.

Russia scored eight points in the final 36 seconds to break open a tight game and beat Canada 73-66 in another battle of previously unbeaten teams in Pool C at Copps Coliseum in Hamilton, Ontario.

Both winners as well as their vanquished opponents had already clinched spots in the quarter final round, which begins on Monday.

## Pakistan end visitors' jinx



COLOMBO, Aug 7: Pakistan held off a spirited challenge from Sri Lanka's ninth-wicket pair to clinch the one-day series with a 19-run win in the third and final one-day international here Sunday, reports AFP.

Pakistan's win also ended Sri Lanka's record of being unbeaten in every one-day series played at home since 1986.

Despite a last-ditch 76-run stand between tail-enders Ruwan Kalpage and Chaminda Vaas, Sri Lanka were all out for 218 in the 49th over. Pakistan made 237 for seven in their 50 overs after being put into bat by Arjuna Ranatunga.

Eventually it was skipper Salim Malik's blazing 93 not out that proved to be the match-winner because the gallant fight-back by the Sri Lankan ninth-wicket pair almost stopped the world champions in their victory march.

Malik's 94-ball knock helped the tourists set Sri Lanka a hard task on a slow track that made pace-bowlers Wasim Akram and Waqar Younis exert themselves to the hilt.

Yet, Sri Lanka put on the pressure after the home side were on the verge of another rout at 133 for eight in the 31st over. Vaas played courageously to hold up one end and allow the experienced Kalpage to do most of the scoring.

Akram dashed Sri Lanka's hopes in the 48th over by uprooting the stumps of fast bowler Vaas, who made a brave 33 during the 16.4 over association with the left handed Kalpage.

When Younis shattered last man Muttiah Muralidharan's stumps with the last ball of his final over, Kalpage was unbeaten on a solid 44 that included a mighty mid-wicket six off Younis.

Akram finished with best figures of three for 24 off nine overs while Younis, Malik and left-arm spinner Aamer Sohail claimed two wickets each.

Earlier, Sri Lankan opener coach Tara VanDerveer is named as expected to coach the team.

ST PETERSBURG, Aug 7: (AP) The first international sports event in post-communist Russia failed to generate much interest among St Petersburg residents.

Ignoring the opportunity to watch the Goodwill Games live, those with some interest preferred to watch them on television.

"I watched the figure skating on TV, but I'm too busy during the day and at night I'd better stay home with kids," said Natalia Tsikunova, an economist.

The organising committee has refused to release attendance figures — citing lack of statistics — but television footage has shown most of the events going on with the stands half-empty.

Critics have blamed organisers for setting unreasonably high ticket prices, bad advertising and other glitches.

"City authorities should report on all their expenses," Tsikunova said. "They have spent a lot of money, but the city remains dull and shabby everywhere outside (its main thoroughfare) Nevsky Prospect."

Games' organisers have tried to dismiss snafus like murky water in the SKA pool and delays making at the Yubileiny sports complex. Many athletes have been openly critical.

World record-holder Sergei Bubka who has enthusiastically welcomed the Games before they started, expressed his disappointment in an interview with the daily Nevskoye Vremya.

"I knew in advance that Moscow and Seattle would never repeat, but I didn't expect these Games to be that bad," he said.

Sanath Jayasuriya made his third consecutive half-century but the rest of the strong batting line-up crumbled to the Pakistani pace attack.

It was Akram who triggered the early collapse when he snatched two wickets in two balls to have Sri Lanka reeling at 13 for two.

Younis had his first victim when he had vice-captain Aravinda de Silva offering a comfortable catch to Malik for 21.

The presence of star batsman Roshan Mahanama for the first time in the series seemed to boost Sri Lanka's flagging morale but the right-hander, playing his 100th one-day international, failed to get into top gear.
