

Road accidents claim three in city

Three persons, including a school boy, were killed in separate road accidents in the city yesterday.

A student of Class VI was killed in a collision between a minibus and an auto-rickshaw at Rampura yesterday evening.

Fourteen-year-old Masud was seriously injured in the accident and was sent to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) where the doctors on duty declared him dead.

No other casualties in the incident were reported.

In another road mishap, a pedestrian was killed when a speeding microbus ran over him at Alauddin Avenue under Uttara police station about

5:30 pm yesterday.

The victim, Mohammed Hossain, 40, died instantly. Police seized the microbus (Dhaka Metro Ma-02-0672) and arrested driver Mohammed Anwar Hossain.

A case was filed with Uttara Police Station.

Another pedestrian Mohammed Amir Ali, 30, died when a speeding truck knocked him at Gulshan Thursday night.

The victim was fatally injured and rushed to the DMCH where he died early yesterday.

AL-Juba Command clash

Four injured in Khulna

KHULNA, Aug 12: Four people, including a cop, were injured by bullet in a clash between supporters of the Awami League and Juba Command here today, reports UNB.

Witnesses and police said the clash erupted when activists of Chhatra League and Juba League chased a procession of Juba Command in the city this afternoon. Both the groups carried firearms, sticks and iron rods.

Police fired 50 rounds of bland shots and lobbed teargas shells to bring the situation under control.

The injured, identified as Rezaul Islam of Islami Chhatra Shibir, Faruque Ahmed and Moteleb Hossain of Chhatra League and police constable Kalyan Kumar were admitted to a city hospital.

Earlier, Chhatra-Juba League and Juba Command held rallies at Hadis Park and Dak-Bungalow premises respectively. The Juba Command's rally was marked by gunshots and bomb blasts, witnesses said.

The district administration imposed section 144 at Maharaj Chatter where the two groups were scheduled to hold rallies today at the same time.

Section 144 was also imposed at other vantage points of the city to avert further clashes.

The Transparency International (TI), a global non-government watchdog against corruption, will open its Bangladesh Chapter by the end of this month.

This Bangladesh Chapter of the TI will act as a national level solidarity movement for curbing corruption in the country. Peter Eigen, visiting chairman of the TI Board told UNB yesterday.

Eigen said its objective will be to establish a national coalition of like-minded individuals and organisations to work with government to help in developing and implementing national anti-corruption programmes.

The national chapter will also help secure support for TI's international programme of action against global corruption.

Eigen, a former World Bank official, said the newest chapter of TI will try to monitor and promote governmental actions to curb corruption in all its forms, including international business deals.

He said it will try to stimulate public awareness of the damages of corruption which exists in one form or the other in all countries of the world.

Govt docs asked to observe strike

The Bangladesh Medical Association (BMA) has called on the government doctors to observe a 48-hour countrywide strike from August 17 to press for cancellation of suspension orders against 12 doctors of Tongi and Gazipur, reports UNB.

A representatives' meeting at BMA bhaban yesterday also urged the doctors to continue 8-hour work stoppage everyday up to August 16.

The meeting, chaired by BMA president Dr M A Majed, demanded the removal of the Health Secretary, holding him responsible for repressive measures against doctors, and dissolution of the vigilance team.

It protested the cancellation of the deputation system for doctors' higher studies and demanded that it be restored immediately.
