In 1989, the WB suspended all loans to the power sector when the system loss reached a staggering about 44 per cent and the collection rate of the Power Development Board (PDB) was extremely poor.

The bank sought a substantial reduction in the system loss and improvement in collection before resuming loans to the sector.

At the upcoming meeting the WB mission would be led by a senior official from Washington, Janet Koch, while the home team would be led by Energy Secretary, Faizur Razzak

According to an authoritative source, the WB had expressed strong dissatisfaction over the system loss, saying it was one of the worst in the world, and said it must be lowered by another 10 to 12 per

On the other hand, it observed that the much-awaited power sector reform programme is yet to get the Cabinet's approval.

The reform, among other things; aims at commercialisa tion of the agencies, private participation in the boards of the agencies, reform of the managements, and giving power to the agencies to enhance upto five per cent of the tariff at their own discretion.
