From Page 1 Col 4 overseas demand of the new product would increase manifold because of its environ ment-friendly and pollutionfree nature.

Terming the innovation of the technology as a milestone in the quest for agro-diversity, she said the International Geotextile Society had already recognised the product.

"Realistic programmes have been taken up to increase diversified uses of jute for revival of jute and the jute industry." Begum Zia said, referring to the steps taken by her government to revitalise the ruined economy it had inherited.

Technology for producing pulp from green jute has been developed in the country and already applied in producing industrial grade paper, she pointed out. Items like quality jute clothes, bags, curtains, chadars, wallcovers, nursery pots and garbage bags have also been evolved from jute.

"I think commercial production of these products will cut import and boost export. We'll get back the tradition and lost glory of the golden fibre," she said, adding "it is estimated that local consumption of jute will increase by 50 per cent. The jute mills will utilise their maximum capacity."

The Prime Minister also stressed the need for the best application of innovative faculty and creativity to reach the de-

sired goal of development. Agriculture and Irrigation Minister Majid-ul Huq appreciated the innovation and lauded the success achieved in diversification of jute in the three years since this govern ment took over.

Dr Zahid Hossain Prodhan, in his keynote paper, said the soil of Bangladesh is ideal for application of geotextile which is designed as biodegradable and hydrophobic in nature, friendly to the environment and even usable by our unskilled labour.

It has been proved that jute geotextile can definitely be used in various earthen structures such as fibre-drain, separators, filter and reinforced material in roads and highways, embankments, dams, barrages, railway tracks and defence constructions, said Prodhan, who has gleaned 15 years of experience in the field of geotextile-related erection engineering in European coun-

"Jute geotextile is most important because jute can be used in bulk internally due to flexible and drapable properties of the fibre ... it can easily take the shape of contours under any condition," he added.
