The twenty-seven-year-old left-arm speedster vesterday pushed up his tally to 254 wickets from 174 one-day in ternationals when he claimed three wickets to shape a Pakistan's 27-run win over hosts Sri Lanka in the last match of the series which the visitors pocketed at a comfortable margin of 4-1.

The former Pakistan captain had drawn level with Indian allrounder Kapil Dev as the top wicket-taker last Monday with a haul of 251.
