JHENIDAH, Sept 6: Nonregistration of marriage deeds is one of the many reasons of women tortures including divorce and demand for dowry.

A survey in some rural areas of Jhenidah and Magura districts showed that the marriages of many poor families were not registered. As a result the victims could not take any legal action against the unscrupulous husbands.

On the other hand, defying the government restrictions many people specially in the rural areas marry a second or third time without written permission of the first wife.

There are certain legal safeguards for a woman in the conditions of the marriage deed but as no such deeds are signed, divorce has become a common feature in the rural areas. The women 'are com-

Like every year, the devastating erosion has once again taken serious turn with the rise in the water level in the rivers. This year too, erosion has forced thousands of people homeless. About five lakh people, mostly poor, have taken shelter on roads, and other places. The railway ghat, which was earlier shifted to a new site, needs shifting again as the river, neighbouring the area, continues to engulf new areas. Many of the shops at the ghat area were devoured recently by the erosion.

Measures so far taken by the concerned authority to check erosion in the district were alleged too inadequate. Thousands of acres of crop land in the district, grabbed by the river erosion during the past years, has seriously affected crop output from the district. Recently, they have submitted an application to the Dewanganj thana authorities asking for their rehabilitation. One Nazrul Islam, Chairman of Shapdri union under Islampur thana told this correspondent that he took shelter in Islampur thana officers' staff quarter after he lost his home stead by the Jamuna erosion.

SHLHET, Sept 6: Hundreds of Biman passengers bounded for different destinations abroad are being 'off loaded' from the flights in Sylhet-Dhaka routes for the last few days causing 'extreme suffer-

Passengers bounded for Middle · East and European countries are the worst sufferers by situation.

On September 3 (Saturday) a total of 130 passengers were given confirmed bookings for the second flight from Sylhet. The F-28 aircraft of the scheduled flight had only 84 seats. So, fortysix passengers were "off loaded" from the flight. Twentyfive other passengers were 'off loaded' from the third flight on the same day. However, all these passengers destined to fly outside the country were sent through a special and additional flight

after several hours of delay. The Biman authorities. however, denied the allegations about the frequent off loading of passengers for the last few days.

A number of 'off loaded' passengers alleged that, the Biman authorities did not alert them earlier regarding the sudden 'off loading' causing much inconversiences.

Most of the travellers come to the country on a short visit. They have to face a lot of trouble while returning due to



### Health complexes in Barguna gripped with problems

BARGUNA, Sept 6: Scarcity of medicine in different health complexes in the district has been causing inconvenience to the patients.

Local people alleged that ordinary medicines like dettol. paracetamol are not available in almost all the thana health complexes.

A huge number of patients coming from far flung areas to the thana health complexes every day are to go back disappointed due to lack of proper treatment and admission facili-

Some of thana health complexes are without doctors and it is alleged that in the absence of physicians either compounder or staff members give

prescriptions to the patients. The doctors posted in the Frural areas are reluctant to discharge their responsibilities as they are found busy to get transfer to elsewhere in urban

to town areas. It is also alleged that some doctors without attending the patients at the health complexes are found busy with their private practice.

The physicians of the thana and union health complexes are also said to be unwilling to attend the outdoor patients due to non-availability of medicines.

Local people said that some dishonest officials of the health complexes were involved in selling medicines in the black market.

Our Correspondent adds:

. Almost all the non-government high schools of the district have been facing innumerable problems hampering education greatly, reports UNB.

Shortage of furniture and accommodation, lack of educational appliances, fund contraints and lack of requisite number of teachers are the main problems.

Some of these schools established under local initiative have not received government recognition despite provisions of requisite facilities. Meanwhile, a few of them are facing closure due to fund constraints.

Accommodation problem is acute and many students are to attend their classes standing due to lack necessary benches and tables.

Many school houses damaged by cyclones and floods some years back are yet to be repaired much to the incon-

venience of students and teachers who are forced to attend classes under the sky Local elite have urged the

concerned authorities to take immediate steps to remove the problems to ensure proper education in the district.

### 305 bags of fertilizer stolen from BADC store

BHOLA, Sept 6: Some 305 bags of urea fertilizer, worth Tk 76,000, were stolen from the BADC godown of the district on Aug 31, reports UNB.
