

Title aspirants Muktijoddha Sangsad Krira Chakra began their second round campgn of the Star Premier Division

He Cihong also set a new mark for the 100 backstroke. swimming the first leg in 1:00.16 to beat the record of Hungary's Kristina Egerszegi by 0.15.

Backstroker Lea Loveless and freestyler Jenny Thompson, who were on the squad that set the previous mark at the Barcelona Olympics two vears ago, placed second here to win the silver. though 4.86 seconds behind the winners.

American long-distance specialist Janet Evans held on to her 800-meter title by a whisker but countryman Jef Rouse, like Evans the world record holder, lost his 100 backstroke championship in the last 20 meters to Spain's Martin Lopez-Zubero, world record owner over 200.

Host nation Italy won its first gold medal of the championships by defeating Spain 10-5 in men's water polo in a rematch of the three-overtime 1992 Olympic final, also won by the Italians.

Russia defeated Croatia 14-13 in overtime to capture the

bronze. The United States had success in the synchro swimming pool when BeckyDyroen-Lancer won her second gold of the championships, teaming up with Jill Sudduth in the duet.

Popov, the Russian with the slow, almost leisurely-looking stroke, moved smoothly down the Foro Italico pool to win the 22.17 the fastest time of the

American swimmer Gary Hall, also silver medalist behind Popov in the 100 final was second in 22.44, almost half a body length beltind.


Raimundas Majolis won Lithuania's first world champi onship medal by taking third in 22.52 ahead of Brazilian Gustavo Borges, bronze medalist in the 100.

In the 800 fréestyle, 2.3 year old Evans, who is two time Olympic Champion, took over the lead from Australia's Hayley Lewis after 300 and appeared in control.

Rouse was already leading when the backstrokers got into their first strokes but was caught near the end of the race by Lopez-Zubero. The Spaniard clocked 55.17 for a championship record with Rouse, whose world mark is 53.86, touching in 55.51.

won the bronze. Lu Bin, who won silver nedals in the 100 and 200 fre estyle in times that were insic e world records, collected the gold medal in the women's 200 individual med-

Lu clocked 2:12.34 to finish well clear of American swimmer Allison Wagner, who had 2:14.40. Wagner also won the silver in the 400 medley.

Australia's Elli Overton, the Commonwealth champion, took the bronze.

Russia's Denis Pankratov, who won a bronze in the 100 butterfly final, made it gold in the 200 with a start-to-finish triumph, clocking 1:56.54.

New Zealand's Danyon Loader, the Olympic silver medalist, was second, 1.45 behind with Germany's Chris-Carol Bremer third and American swimmer Ugur Taner fourth.

In the synchro pool, Dyroen-Lancer and Sudduth finished ahead of Japan's Fumiko Okumo and Miya Tachabana to win the gold medal.

The United States is favoured also to win Sunday's team event final and if it does, Dyroen-Lancer would have picked up three gold medals.

Australian Kieren Perkins who broke the 800 and 1,500 world records two weeks ago at the Commonwealth Games and the 400 mark here Friday, appeared to take it easy in the 1,500 heats. The final is Sunday, the last day of the championships.

This time he swam 15:13.95, well over a half minute slower than his world record 14:41.66 set in Victoria, British Columbia. Behind him in heat four,
