Boris Becker left in cold Ma to market



Three-time Wimbledon champion Borts Becker. who has been embroiled in pub-

lic rows about Germany's Davis Cup team in recent years, will play no part in helping his country defend their title this season, reports Reuter. Team captain Niki Pilic said

on Tuesday that Becker would not be selected if Germany reached the final after this week's semifinal against Russia because he had not competed in the earlier rounds.

"Boris is very welcome in the team but not until next year." Pilic said in an interview with the German magazine

"If we get in the final I can't pick him ... I have a moral obligation. I can't pick someone who hasn't played all year and then throw out someone else who has been in the team all season."

Becker, who led Germany to their first triumph in 1988 and helped them defend the title the following year, has not played for his country since September 1992 when he took part in a relegation playoff against Belgium.

OJ Simpson to stand trial

Superior Court Judge Lance Ito Monday upheld an earlier ruling by Municipal Court Judge Kathleen Kennedy-Powell that detectives acted properly when they entered Simpson's estate hours after the June 12 slayings without a search warrant and found bloody evidence. Kennedy-Powell presided over Simpson's preliminary hearing over the summer.

In another development, prosecutors complained that Simpson's personal secretary shredded a document fafter prosecutors had tried to seize


