TOKYO, Sept 24: Arantxa Sanchez Vicario trounced Amy Frazier 6-1, 6-2 Sunday for the singles title of the Nichirei international ladies tennis championships, and said she feels she is closing in on the world's No. 1 ranking, reports

Sanchez Vicario also teamed with Julie Halard of France to beat Frazier and Rika Hiraki of Japan 6-1, 0-6, 6-1 for the doubles title.

"I am really enjoying playing tennis with great confidence. I am now closer to the world's No. 1 position," said the 22year-old Spanish player.

She now is ranked No. 2 behind Steffi Graf of Germany, but has won seven tournaments this season including the US and French Opens.

"I have improved my game a lot. I can now play well on different surfaces," said Sanchez Vicario, who has been strongest on clay but won the US Open and this tournament on hard courts.

In her 57-minute match against Frazier, an American seeded seventh, Sanchez Vicario rated her performance "almost 100 per cent."

SA edge past India in Davis Cup

JAIPUR, India, Sept 25: South Africa defeated India in the Davis Cup group playoff tie Sunday and related last year's semifinalists to a zonal rounds, reports AP.

Marcus Ondruska beat Asif Ismail in the crucial second reverse singles, negating the victory of Leander Paes who easily defeated Wayne Ferreira their qualifying round

The winners of the competition go into the top 16 Davis Cup teams.

Paes, ranked 150 in the world, beat 14th-ranked Ferreira in straight sets 6-3, 6-4, 7-5 in a match that lasted just

over two hours. Paes played a great game. with good serves and swift returns to give India a great beginning. Ferreira failed to find his rhythm and banged his racked on the ground and side boards several times, prompting the referee to give him a warning.



Lewis started strong in the second round, but then came the right hand from McCall And although Lewis got up and was on his feet, there was no question he was hurt.

"I am absolutely sure of what I did," referee Garcia said. "Lennox Lewis was knocked out. To allow more punches to Lennox Lewis would have fatal consequences. My duty is to protect the health of the fighter."

McCall, who was supposed to make dlrs 1 million, improved to 25-4 with 18 knockouts. Lewis, whose purse was dlrs 3.5 million, now has a 25-1 record with 21 knock-

Stich accused the German Federation (DTB) of not taking the threat seriously and of fail ing to deal with the problem in a professional manner.

The federation defended its security measures, and said Stich was not aware of the 17 plainclothes policemen who were on duty at the court

Even if the dispute over the threat is quickly forgotten. there are other problems.

For the first time in a decade, a Davis Cup match in Germany was not sold out.
