

Two out of 20 plague victims in Delhi die

NEW DELHI, Sept 30: The number of suspected plague cases shot up by more than 100 in the Indian capital today as authorities grappled to control the disease which has claimed 52 lives across the

country, reports AFP. The spurt in suspected cases of pneumonic plague came after the deaths of two plague sufferers in New Delhi reported earlier today, the first outside western India.

Delhi Chief Minister Madan Lal Khurana said 20 of the 121 people hospitalised as of today with symptoms of plague were suffering from the disease.

The federal government asserted it would stamp out plague, which has affected more than 1,500 others within 10 days, and appealed to foreign airlines not to shun India as tourists here faced almost

no risk of infection. lu Britain, doctors said eight people who recently visited India had shown plaguelike symptoms. Three were cleared while diagnostic results were pending from the five others.

Procession against doctors' strike attacked in city

When the procession reached opposite to the Bangladesh Medical Asso ciation (BMA) office some people started hurling brickbats at the procession at around 4:30 pm. The processionists also retaliated with stones and bricks.

No serious injuries on either side were reported in the ten-minute brick batting.

Earlier, the PPPKSP held a protest rally at the Janasankhya Bhaban which demanded legal action against the BMA, which had eailed the indefinite strike from

Hasina accuses PM of misusing state media

Opposition Leader Sheikh Hasina, yesterday accused Prime Minister Begum Zia of misusing government media to propagate lies in a Goebellian way, reports UNB.

In a statement, Hasina referred to the Prime Minister's announcement of Chittagong as a Commercial capital at a public meeting there on September 28 and said, "No one has heard her announcing Chittagong as a commercial capital." She said newspapers have

rightly published reports questioning the veracity of the announcement, she said.

Hasina alleged that the PM used the BSS, radio and television to say so in the same manner as she did to "falsify the truth of shooting at me in a train compartment at the Ishurdi railway station."

"By resorting to such brazen lies and false propaganda, Begum Khaleda Žia put ir shahie the hes of the littler era. It is obvious that her ways are highly immoral and antidemocratic, which clearly amount to abuse of power."

This has forfeited the credibility of the government media, including the radio, television and BSS, now captive in her hands and she must not be allowed to worsen it any further, Hasina said.

KHULNA, Sept 30: Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia today announced that the foundation stone of a longcherished bridge over the Rupsha river here would be laid by the year-end, report

Protect Munshiganj from erosion: Hasina

TUNGIBARI. (Munshiganj) Sept 30: Opposition Leader Sheikh Hasina today branded the BNP government 'corrupt and callous,' and said it can not alleviate the miseries of the people, reports UNB.

The government's indecision and indifference has not only deepened crisis at the national level but also caused immense sufferings to the commonman, she told a crosssection of people in the Padma-eroded areas of Munshiganj district in the afternoori.

Hasina, visiting the far-flung areas of Dighirbari, Hashail and Bangla Bazar unions, affected heavily by the erosion of the river Padma, said thousands of poor people have lost their lands and homesteads in the river and become pauper due to the government's apathy towards their plight.

The Awami League chief said Tk 19 crore has been sanctioned to protect Munshiganj but no anti-erosion measure was taken by the government. She called for formulating a pragmatic plan to protect Munshiganj from erosion. Hundreds of men, women

and children thronged to the banks of the Padma braving drizzles when the Opposition leader visited the erosion-hit areas in Tungibari thana by motor launch. She talked to the erosion victims and distributed sarees, lungis and rice among them.

"So long this government remains in power, your misery will remain," she told a crowd at Dighirbari.

Four of a family killed in road accident

Five people - four of them from a family - were killed and over 20 others injured in a major road accident near the Bhaber Char bus stand on the Dhaka-Chittagong highway under Munshiganj district vesterday evening.

All five, who died on the spot, were in a car that was crumpled after being squeezed between a Chittagong Dhaka bus and a truck Passengers of the bus, which skidded after impact and plunged into a roadside ditch were injured.

According to witnesses, the tragedy occurred around 7 pm when the car coming from Chandpur reportedly tried to overtake the bus and collided
