"Considering all aspects of the problem, it seems there will be no significant impact on the present wildlife of the areas concerned," leader of the study teams Prof Kazi Zaker Husain told The Daily Star

"Perhaps the whole operation would be a blessing in disguise ... as the trees on the embankments and approach roads would provide good shelter for the birds, said Prof Husain who is a teacher of Zoology department of Dhaka

The other members of the team are: Prof S U Sarker, M K Rahman and Dr Anwarul Islam. The study was undertaken

in view of reports that the project areas were food and breeding habitats for 'resident' and migratory birds. The donors also insisted on ensuring that wildlife in the project areas should not be affected, Prof Zaker Husain said.

During the eight month study, the wildlife experts found nine species of mammals, 169 species of birds, nine species of reptiles and six species of amphibians. - All the species of mammals
