## Garments quota rules may be amended

The Commerce Ministry's proposal to restructure the quota system of the garments sector is likely to be placed soon before the cabinet again for approval.

The eight-point proposal was considered by the cabinet at a meeting in August and sent to the committee on finance and economic affairs for further review and scrutiny. According to official

sources, the cabinet committee has completed the scrutiny and sent the proposal back to the Commerce Ministry with some minor amendments. The ministry is now preparing to place it before the Cabinet as soon as possible, sources concerned said. To facilitate a balanced de-

velopment of the garments industry, the Commerce Ministry had proposed amendment to The Textile Quota and Trade Administration Rules, 1991 and placed it for the consideration of the cabinet November 9, 1992. The cabinet formed a committee to examine the proposal and make recommendations accordingly.

In case of smaller availability of quota, the allocation would be made on 'first some first served basis or through lot-
