

But the blues continued for the blue half of the city as Everton lost again to make it 11 games without a win since the start of the session with the pressure increasing on manager Mike Walker.

They went down 1-0 at Crystal Palace - their sixth successive away league defeat as the London side won at home in the league for the first time since April and for only the second time this season, thanks to a 53rd-minute Andy Preece goal, his first since his summer move from Stockport.

McManaman scored with a curling 20-metre shot that found its way to the top corner and then created the second for Fowler who slotted home his eighth league goal with a neat shot. The only surprise in a one-

sided match was that Liverpool did not add to their goal tally until Barnes netted for the second successive Saturday just past the hour. Wimbledon's fourth successive league defeat left the

London club just three places off the bottom. Norwich turned on a scientillating second-half performance to score four goals in just 16 minutes against QPR on their way to a 4-2 win.
