

Export target likely to be slashed by 11 pc

The government is planning to downsize the 1994-95 export target by 11.43 per cent due to a declining trend in earnings from some key export sectors, well-placed sources at the Commerce Ministry confirmed yesterday.

The subject is expected to top the agenda of the Export Promotion Bureau's board meeting scheduled for today. Chaired by Commerce Minister M Shamsul Islam the meeting is likely to finalise the decision to revise the export earning target from 3,500 million US dollars to 3,100 million dollars for the current fiscal year.

The move comes in the backdrop of a sharp drop in export earnings during the first two months of the ongo-


