

SYDNEY, Nov 9: Australian batsman Mark Waugh claims England pace spearhead Devon Malcolm still has to prove himself over an extended period in Test cricket, reports

Waugh, who returned this week from Australia's tour of Pakistan, will play for Sheffield Shield champions New South Wales against the tourists in a four-day game starting Saturday in Newcastle.

The right-hander scored a century on his Test debut against an England attack containing Malcolm in January 1991 and also prospered in last year's Ashes series in England.

Malcolm, who took 1-166 in his Test debut against Australia in 1989, has performed patchify in Ashes clashes. He took 16 wickets at


