

According to the provisions of the Bill, the identity card shall be laminated and bear (a) a photograph of the elector, (b) the name and signature or thumb impression of the elector. (c) the serial number of the elector in the electoral rolls, (d) the signature of an officer of the commission authorised on this behalf, (e) the seal of the commission, and such other particulars, if any, as the commission deems fit to specify.

The Bill seeks provisions for punishment with imprisonment for a term upto six months or with a fine upto Taka one, thousand or with both if any person makes any

false declaration in connection with the preparation, revision or correction of an electoral roll, or the inclusion or deletion of any entry in or from an electoral roll, a statement or declaration in writing which is false and which he either knows or believes to be false

Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia, in a sharp riposte to the Leader of the Opposition's recent threat to paralyse everything, said yesterday that the students activists of her party were enough to tackle the Opposition.

"Those who believe in democracy and development and love the country and its people, cannot frequently issue threats to paralyse and destroy everything," she told a huge gathering of the ruling BNP's student activists at the Shapla intersection in the capital's Motijheel area yesterday after-

"We never speak in such manner because we believe in democratic practice, freedom of speech and public welfare," said the BNP chairperson.

Reacting to Opposition threats to bring the country to a standstill unless its demand for a caretaker government was conceded, the Prime Minister, pointing her finger at the huge gathering, said; "They are enough to resist them (Opposition) and thwart their destructive designs. Yet would ask them to exercise restraint.

"The BNP was voted to power by the people and it will not quit because of anybody's threat. The party will continue to remain in power as long as it enjoyed the people's confidence" Begum Zia declared amid clappings and thunderous slogans.

Markets for most agri items in Bangladesh inefficient: WB

Donors have suggested that marketing infrastructure and services in the country should be developed on priority basis to turn agriculture into an export-oriented sector and ensure fair price to the farmers. reports UNB.

When agricultural markets are well-developed, they pointed out, goods move from producers to intermediate contractors and final consumers relatively quickly and at low cost, minimising prices to agro-processors and consumers and maximising returns to the producers.

According to a World Bank study, markets for perishable, non-grain crops in the country are underdeveloped and inefficient. As a result, neither

producers' nor consumers' interests are served and agricultural diversification is constrained.

Market development may in turn encourage farmers to branch out of a grain self-sufficiency mode of production, and undertake diversified, commercial activity, the study There are no minimum

standards set by the government for operation of markets," the study said referring to absence of adequate space, linkroads, sheds, cemented open market yards, internal roads, lanes, loading-unloading and packaging facilities, and sanitation facilities, which pose serious problems for smooth operation of the mar-


