

China determined to rejoin GATT

BEIJING, Nov 28: Chinese Prime Minister Li Peng has reaffirmed China's determination to rejoin GATT by the end of the year and become a founding member of the World Trade Organisation (WTO), major newspapers reported today, says AFP.

"The conditions are ripe for China's re-entry to GATT, Li was quoted as saying only days before the opening in Geneva of final negotiations on the China's re-entry to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, which is to be replaced on January 1 by the WTO.

"It is natural and reasonable that China rejoins GATT and become a founder member of the WTO," he said during a meeting Sunday in Beijing with Iceland Prime Minister David Oddsson.

"China needs the world and the world also needs China," Li added.

The United States and the European Union support China's application but want it to further open up its markets and accord better respect for intellectual property rights.

Several US and European leaders have recently said that China would probably not succeed in rejoining GATT this year.

US Congress to approve Uruguay Round next week

WASHINGTON, Nov 28: Congress will approve the Uruguay Round of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) next week, enabling the United States to bring a powerful message of free trade and international cooperation to its hemispheric partners at the Summit of the Americas in Miami next month, predicts the State Department's summit coordinator, reports USIS.

Charles A Gillespie Jr told reporters in Ottawa, Caracas, Lima, Tegucigalpa and Buenos Aires Nov 23 that President Clinton will carry this message to the other leaders of the region as a precursor to further cooperative efforts that the Miami talks are intended to generate. He answered the reporters' questions in a Worldnet satellite television programme.

Although the American people's elected representatives have concerns about GATT, both the House, on Nov 29, and the Senate, on Dec 1, will almost certainly approve

the pact. "We will go into the summit with a really strong statement about the United States and its commitment to a global trading system," Gillespie said.

This basic message is critically important because the summit is a meeting of equals and the United States must demonstrate its faith in free trade among equals, he added.

"The Summit of the Americas is not about US policy in Latin America or North America or the Caribbean. This is a meeting of the leaders of the 34 nations of the hemisphere" to advance the fortunes of the entire region, he said.

"It is not so much what the United States will take to the summit," he added. "More important will be the commitments of the 34 leaders."

The summit will be "a celebration of democracy," Gillespie said, lamenting how "sad that in 1994 all but one of the nations in this hemisphere are able to sit down together... in support of democracy. Cuba's absence is of course due to

Cuba's own decisions." Asked whether Washington will do anything to bring Cuba into the comity of nations, Gillespie said: "Until Cuba makes significant and irreversible changes in... government, the US is not prepared to make any moves in that direction."

"We will respond based on what those steps might be, based on our judgment," he asserted.

"For the nations of the hemisphere it seems very clear there is an interest in spreading democracy and seeing Cuba come into the democratic community. That is a very strong, very positive shared objective and there might be some discussion of that when the leaders meet in Miami," although the subject is not on the agenda, he said.

Gillespie predicted President Clinton and the 33 other democratically elected leaders would arrive at important decisions about the future of the hemisphere and that the Organisation of American States

(OAS) would have a "broad range of activities" in the future in support of those decisions. The OAS "will have a very direct responsibility for follow-up action," he predicted.

Gillespie reiterated that the Summit will likely focus on three areas of concern: democracy, trade, and economic growth, and sustainable development.

Japan plans to cut budget for first time in 40 years

TOKYO, Nov 28: Japan's Finance Ministry plans to cut the budget for the first time in 40 years for the fiscal year starting in April to offset a severe shortfall in tax revenues, the daily Mainichi Shimbun reported yesterday, says Reuter.

The daily said the austerity budget would not exceed 71 trillion yen (71 billion dollars), compared to the 73.08 trillion yen (73 billion dollars) for the current fiscal year.

This would be the first year-on-year decrease in the overall budget since 1955, the daily said. Japan's worst post-war recession has severely cut tax revenues, especially corporate taxes.

Finance Ministry officials were not available for comment on Saturday.

Budget requests from the various government ministries submitted in August totalled 76.57 trillion yen (77 billion dollars).

Mainichi said spending to be cut includes education and welfare.

At the close of trading on November 28, 1994 Turnover in value surges

The turnover in value on the Dhaka Stock Exchange (DSE) surged on Monday while the price index fell significantly.

A total of 111949 shares changed hands at Tk 47788956.50 as against Sunday's 94057 shares valued at Tk 14419798.00.

The changes showed 231.41 per cent and 19.02 per cent increases in the turnover in value and volume respectively.

The DSE All Share Price Index dropped to 881.90410 from 887.33604, indicating a decline of 0.6122 per cent.

The number of issues traded rose to 89 from 77, in which 30 gained, 48 incurred losses and the share prices of 11 issues remained unchanged.

Monno Jute experienced a gain of Tk 203.50 per share, leading the gainers in terms of value.

Monno Ceramic, Beximco Fisheries (Deb), and Beximco Knitting (Deb) incurred significant losses.

Eastern Cables became the top volume leader. Its 8800 shares were traded.




