

### No secret deal

TAIPEI. Dec 7: Taiwan's top Olympic official denied on Wednesday that Taipei had made a secret deal to vote for Sydney to host the 2000 Olympics instead of Beijing. reports Reuter. I know nothing about the

alleged secret deal with Sydnev as the foreign press reported." state television quoted Wu Ching-Kuo. Taiwan's representative on the International Olympic Committer (IOC), as saying.

"No form of pressure was imposed on the voting."

The Sydney Morning Herald newspaper said Australia secretly agreed to lobby for Taiwan to take part in a first summit of Asian-Pacific leaders in 1993, on condition that Taipei backed Sydney's Olympic bid

Sydney snatched the right to hold the Olympic Games in 2000 from Beijing by a mere two votes in the final round of voting by IOC delegates in September last year.

The newspaper said Australian Prime Minister Paul Keating met Taiwanese government adviser Dr Jeffrey Koo on August 13 last year, about six weeks before the key vote on who would host the games.

Keating "agreed to lobby US President Bill Clinton, to invite a senior Taiwanese political figure to attend the (first) Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) forum in Seattle last November," the paper said.

"In return Mr Keating ... demanded that Taiwan delivers the vote of its International Olympic Committee member. Mr Ching Kuo Wu, to Sydney instead of Beijing," it said.

Koo was not available for comment in Taipei.

A few days after his meeting with Keating and a week before the Olympics vote, Clintonannounced that he would invite a senior Taiwanese minister to the Seattle APEC sum-

China's objections to Taiwan's membership of APEC had previously prevented its attendance at APEC forum meetings.

If Taiwan had voted for Beijing, the vote would have been tied and left to IOC president Juan Antonio Samaranch's casting vote.

Taiwan and China have been rivals since the ruling nationalists lost the Civil War in China in 1949 and fled to Taiwan.



The case also could turn into an embarrassment for Nagano, a provincial capital 179 kilometers (112 miles) west of Tokyo that is hoping to present a welcoming face to foreigners for the 1998 winter

Some commentators have questioned whether Nagano can match the widely praised performance by Lillehammer, Norway, in hosting the Winter Olympics this year, especially with the language barrier.

Earlier this year Nagano officials caused a stir by suggesting they might not pay travel expenses for athletes as previously promised.

England manager Mike Smith said the appointment had been confirmed by chairman of selectors Ray Illing-

"Angus said he would be delighted to join us," Smith said. Fraser said: "I'm very pleased. I'm happy to be involved again and I'm looking forward to it.

Tve been happy with the way I've been bowling for Western Suburbs, the standard of cricket is pretty good and it's been nice to pick up a few wickets after a hard summer.

"It's going to be difficult for us to turn things round as the Aussies are a very good side but we've shown that when we play well we can beat anyone."

Earlier England decided to send McCague home for treatment to a stress fracture to his right shin.

"Medical advice is that Martin needs a month to six weeks to make a full recovery. Smith said.

"Under those circumstances, we feel it is in his and the tour's best interests that he returns to Britain."

Smith said McCague's rehabilitation would be monitored and he could rejoin the tour if he regained fitness quickly enough.

#### J-League gees up have-nots

TOKYO, Dec 7: Japan's professional soccer league decided on Tuesday to revise its winner-takes-all system and award a point for teams who lose a match on a penalty shoot-out, the Kyodo News Agency reported, reports Reuter.

The J-League, which started in 1993, is the first professional league to outlaw draws.

At present matches tied after 90 minutes go to a sudden-death extra time period and if this fails to produce a winner after 30 minutes the game goes to a penalty shootout with the winner receiving all three points.

In the season starting next May, winners will still receive three points but losers who survive to a shoot-out will get

J-League chairman Saburo Kawabuchi said it had been unfair on teams such as Kashima Antiers, who lost three consecutive games on penalty shoot-outs this season.

LONDON, Dec 7: England are lining up a friendly soccer match with Colombia in Miami on February 15 to replace a game against Italy, which has been called off, reports Reuter.
