PM donates Tk 2 lakh to Islamic centre in NY

Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia has donated Taka two lakh to an Islamic education centre in New York city, where children of Bangladeshi expatriates receive their first lessons of the holy Quran and in Islam, reports BSS.

Ambassador Reaz Rahman, Permanent Representative of Bangladesh to the United Nations handed over the cheque on behalf of the Prime Minister to Moulana Muhammad Golam Hossain, general secretary of Brooklyn-based multipurpose American Islamic Education Centre, at a simple ceremony at the permanent mission of Bangladesh to the UN on Thursday, a message from New York said.

The multipurpose American Islamic Education Centre was founded by the Bangladeshi expatriates to provide religious education to the children of Bangladeshis living in New York City.

Many non-Bangladeshi children are also receiving Islamic education in the centre.

The students of the centre met the Bangladesh Prime Minister during her visit to New York last year and appealed for help to improve the facilities of the centre.

The Prime Minister assured the students that she would try to help the centre.

During the Prime Minister's visits to the USA in 1992 and 1993, Bangladeshi expatriates also requested for Biman to operate service up to New York and for opening a branch of a Bangladeshi bank in New York to facilitate remittances.

Both the requests were duly followed up by Prime Minister on her return to Dhaka.

The Bangladesh Biman is now operating twice a week flights between Dhaka and New York and Sonali Exchange Bank is being opened next week.

Nakshi Kantha fair in Rome

An exhibition of Nakshi Kantha from Bangladesh was inaugurated in Rome on Thursday, said a press release yesterday, reports UNB.

The exhibition, jointly sponsored by the Embassy of Bangladesh in Italy and Italian Catholic Action National Presidency, was inaugurated by Bangladesh Ambassador in Italy Khurshid Hamid.

In his inaugural speech, the ambassador underlined the depth of culture and heritage common to both the peoples of Bangladesh and Italy and their affinity. Mrs Khurshid Hamid provided a descriptive resume tracing the evolution and legacy of Nakshi Kantha in Bangladesh.

This is the first ever exhibition of Bangladeshi Nakshi Kantha to be held in the capital city of Italy. About three hundred Nakshi Kanhthas on silk and cotton were displayed in the large hall of the historic Domus Marie in Rome.

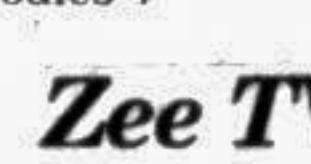
