Their death anniversary was observed through holding milad mahfil held at their elder brother and valiant freedom fighter Mozammel Hossain's Mohakhali residence.



The National Association for Resource Improvement (NARI) in a meeting yesterday to form a common agenda of women's issues to raise the status of women in the SAARC region. reports UNB.

Raheela Twana, Adviser to the Chief Minister of Sindh, Pakistan, attended the meeting as chief guest while Hasna J. Maudud, president of the NARI, presided.

Raheela, here in connection with the meeting of the SAARC Technical Committee on Women, informed that a number of Bangladeshi women are in different jails of Pakistan as illegal immigrants.

Most of the detained women reportedly declined to return to Bangladesh as they are afraid that they would be again caught and put back to human slavery and forced prostitution, Raheela told the meeting.

The qul khwani will be held on Thursday after Asr prayers at his residence at 117, Azimpur.


### Obituary
