

3 pc people suffering from glaucoma

Speakers at a symposium titled 'Glaucoma Update' said three per cent of the population of country above 35 years of age are suffering from glaucoma and of them 86.4 per cent patients are not aware of their ailments, reports BSS.

About 150 leading eye-specialists from home and abroad at the symposium at M A Ispahani Institute of Ophthalmology and Islamia Eye Hospital auditorium yesterday discussed the latest treatment of glaucoma, and eye disease caused by increased pressure in the eyeball, which leads to gradual loss of sight.

They observed that 10 per cent of the country's population are prone to glaucoma and may be affected by the disease

any time. Elderly eye specialist Professor M Mobarak Ali presided over the symposium while eye specialist from Scotland Dr G R Gupta, ophthalmologist from Japan Dr Sabir Reza Hoq and leading eye specialists of Bangladesh including Professor M Mustafizur Rahman, Professor Humayun Kabir, Professor A Q S M Harun, Dr Niaz Rahman and Dr Nazrul Islam presented technical papers on glaucoma treatment.

The speakers laid stress on creating awareness among the people about glaucoma and suggested regular eye-check-up of individuals after 35 years of age.

Prof Abdul Gauyum of the Jahangirnagar University conducted the research while Prof Ahmed Sharif and Prof Mohammad Moniruzzaman were the external examiners.

Experts said Selim's research will contribute significantly to discover the unknown history of the Bengali drama of the ancient and middle ages.

In his research, Selim-Al-Din has shown that there were many styles in Bengali drama before the Eighteenth century.

He also showed that a great portion of drama of Nepal, Assam, and Orissa have been influenced by Bengali drama.
