KISHOREGANJ. Dec 20: River port of Bhairab has become a paradise for the smugglers and smuggled goods have flooded the port town exceeding all previous records, it is observed.

The smuggled goods mostly include spices, sarees, sugar, jira, pulses, cattleheads, cosmetics, onion, chilli turmeric, cutpieces, crackers, cumin seeds, cardamom, medicine,

These contrabands are entering Bhairab Bazar through Akhaura border and bordering areas of Brahmanbaria and Comilla districts and on sale in the market without any restriction. These illegal entry of Indian goods have badly affected the local traders. Worst of all is the entry of cheap and low quality Indian printed sarees which have engulfed Bhairab Bazar. Indian sarees are entering the commercial centre from the · bordering areas by an organised gang of smugglers.

Most of the smugglers are rural women who procure these from the agents and sell

from door to door at prices ranging from Taka 130 to 220. The traders of Bhairab

informed that smuggled goods come here Kanchanpur, Sripur via Brahmanbaria and Ashuganj by buses, trucks and trains from Akhaura. After words they are unloaded at Bhairab railway junction and Meghna ferry ghat. Besides, the agents of smugglers throw away illegal goods from local trains and Sylhet mails at the outer signals of the railway junction. These illegal activities are going on in full swing with active support of the concerned authorities it is learned.

President of Bhairab Shilpakala Academy and of Bhairab Muktejoddha Sangsad alleged that the local administration is responsible for such corruption and also due to the inaction of local law enforcing agency.

The women smugglers move from Kishoreganj to Bhairab, Brahmanbaria. Akhaura and Comilla by train for collecting Indian sarees and other items.

JHENIDAH, Dec 20: Fertility of land decreasing sharply for want of zinc and sulphur in 21 thanas in greater Jessore district.

According to a statistics submitted by a group of soil and agricultural experts, scarcity of zinc and sulphur prevails in cultivable lands in Mohespur, Kotchandpur, Kaliganj. Harinakundu, Sailkupa and Jhenidah sadar thana in Whenidah district, Chougachha, Kesabpur, Abhainagar, Bagharpara. Jhikargachha. Manirampur and Sharsha in Jessore district. Moyura. Sreepur. Salikha, and Mohammedpur in Magura district, Narail. Lahogora and Kalia in Narail district for last 10 years.

The statistics show mainly in those areas where deeptubewells are being used rampantly for high yielding varieties of paddy and wheat lacks zinc and sulphur. In some areas of those thanas the percentage of zinc and sulphur in soil reduced alarmingly to 35 to 50 per cent. As a result, production capacity in those lands decreasing though the

farmers have been trying to get optimum production by applying maximum fertilizers in their lands.

Lack of zinc and sulphur also prevails in high lands. An expert of Agriculture Extension Department told that the farmers are not keenly interested about lack of these two chemicals. Repeated farming or cultivation of some crops like paddy and wheat in same land and improper use of fertilizers are also a main factor to reduce the percentage of zinc and sulphur in the lands, the source added.

The expert says that the farmers might plant Dhanche tree in their land which might help to increase the production capacity of lands as it produces natural manures in the lands. But the authority could not motivate the farmers of rural areas though the government is expending crores of taka in electronics medias to motivate them.

The source also said that "food for all by 2000" would not be possible if the farmers are not motivated.

### Unused water bodies

# Fish worth Taka 385cr can be produced annually from Ctg Div

MOULVI BAZAR, Dec 20: The Chittagong division has been deprived of Taka 385 crore yearly from its fishery sector as about 2 lakh 26 thousand 650 ponds and tanks have been lying uncultivated.

Fish production in the division is declining despite favourable condition for pisciculture due to absence of proper planning. Existing law and acts are yet to be imposed in this sector.

There are 15 districts in the Chittagong division comprising of Sunamganj, Sylhet Moulvibazar, Habigani, Brahmanbaria, Comilla, Chandpur, Laxmipur, Noakhali, Feni, Chittagong, Cox's Bazar, Rangamati, Bandarban and Khagrachhari.

A non-government survey conducted during last fishery season shows that, there are five-lakh 26 thousand 650 ponds and tanks in these districts of the Chittagong Divi-

sion covering an area of one lakh 78 thousand acres of land . Out of them, about three lakh ponds and tanks with an area of one lakh one thousand 800 acres are used for cultivation under pisciculture. The rest of two lakh 26 thousand 650 ponds and tanks with an area of 76 thousand 900 acres have been lying uncultivated though there is a bright prospect of pisciculture.

It is gathered that, annually fish production per acres is one metric ton worth taka 50 thousand. In terms of this statistics, yearly total production from the cultivated ponds and tanks in the Chittagong Division is one lakh one thousand 800 metric tons. So, the division has been deprived of taka 385 crore yearly from those unused water bodies.

Exports are in opinion that, if all of the uncultivated ponds and tanks of the country could

be brought under pisciculture in planned way, the total income in the fishery sector of the country will be enhanced by one thousand crore of taka.

According to the Fishery Department and market survey, the yearly demand of fish in the country is about 19 lakh\* metric tons. But about 2.50 lakh metric tons of fish is produced yearly. About 16.50 lakh metric tons of fish fall short every year in the country.

According to scientific officer of Chittagong Division, interested fish cultivators do not have enough money to continue pisciculture programme.

The experts in this sector in Chittagong Division have outlined some major causes behind not using the ponds and tanks. According to them, the causes are as fallows - (a) interested cultivators have no money to continue pisciculture. (b) Failure to detect the

actual number of those water bodies which are out of cultivation, (c) Dispute over ownership of different water bodies at village level, (d) Insufficient motivation and patronisation by concerned department, (e) Lack of easy bank loan facilities to those interested cultivators who have no ownership of any water bodies, but they are fishcultivator, by profession (f) Lack of proper implementation of existing fishery acts and laws and (g) Massive siltation of ponds and tanks by floods.

To increase the fish production in the Chittagong Division, the government should prepare necessary programme in this regard. Experts said that prospect of pisciculture in the Chittagong Division is so bright that the production can be raised upto the optimum level by properly utilising nearly 2 lakh 26 thousand 650 ponds and removing existing obstacles.
