Business community seeks redress from political leadership'

community is not going to stand idle when their invest ments are threatened by continued political disturbances. warned Salman F Rahman president of the Federation of Bangladesh Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FBCCI). vesterday.

wanting from our collective political leadership is redress: that we are allowed to operate freely without any hindrance's due to political disturbances. he said.

Rahman was speaking on the 'Economic Potentials of Bangladesh' as the guest of honour at the monthly meeting of the American Bangladesh Economic Forum held at a local hotel: The luncheon meeting was presided by Forrest Cookson, president of the forum, and was attended by members of the forum and a number of local and foreign dignitaries.

Starting with an upbeat ac count of the economic prospects of Bangladesh, Rahman sounded rather cautious when commenting on the po-

"I have already upset a few hornet's nests." he said while referring to his recent futile bid to get both the ruling party and the Opposition to sit to gether and listen to the problems of the business commu nity due to the ongoing political stalemate

However, he then went on to seek redress from the political leadership and added. 'We are going to press for this demand. We are afraid that the hindrances from political disturbances may harm us seriously. We have to continue and keep on trying to seek redress because this country is ours and the stake is high'. He said that he was convinced the silent majority would also support the business community in this effort.

"Ultimately we are going to succeed in getting the redress because we are part and parcel of the society." Rahman asserted. We are not going to just stand by and see our investment being affected."

no 'serious' problem. "But if we have the correct enabling environment the market capitalisation will cross the four billion dollar mark in 12 months.

The private sector has proved itself with the performance of the garment sector and if they are given an enabling environment they would perform still better, he noted.

While saying that he is convinced foreign investors would come to Bangladesh, Rahman, however, added the primary reason they are not coming now is because of the image problem of Bangladesh abroad.

"We deliberately wanted to project ourselves as a poor country in order to get more aid," he claimed. Much effort is needed to change that image. he said.

The FBCCI president also talked about the 'frustrations' of the private sector regarding the economic reforms, which, he said, received a positive response from the business community in the hope a level playing field would be created.

"The private sector supported the reforms in the hope a level playing field will be created... but is not easily forthcoming. And our patience is running out," he cautioned.

In reply to another question, the FBCCF president agreed that the existing bureaucratic bottlenecks are a serious problem. "But it will be resolved by a more determined political leadership. (The bureaucrats) will ultimately follow what their political mas-

ters dictate," he said. However, he added, the more serious problem lies in the incompetence of the existing lower and mid-level civil



The percentage of pass in the Science group was 55.01 while in the Humanities group 37.39 and in Commerce group 44.33.

Ninety four thousand, nine hundred and sixty five students took part in the HSC examinations of the Rajshahi Board and 38108 of them passed. Among those passed 4876 got first division, 23647 second division and 9585 third division. In the Science group 49.26 per cent student had been successful while in the Humanities group it was 36.91 and in the Commerce group 43.37.

In the Jessore Board 26306 out of 75928 examinees of three groups had passed showing the percentage in the Science group 51.48, in the Humanities group 31.50 and in the Commerce group 36.77.

The number of student securing first division under the board was 5510 while that in the second division 17016 and in the third division 3780.

The report, which includes 18 recommendations for rehabilitating the textile units, also said the projects forming a group will retain separate individual legal status and will be allowed to continue operation in their respective premises.

It also said that for ensufring continuity of the projects even in the event of sudden demise of the key sponsor or director of a particular project, the projects under the group will exchange in due course among themselves the minimum qualifying shares for cross-directorship in the project-companies.

The rehabilitation programme will be undertaken in a phased manner. In the first phase, priority projects will be selected from the units which have already approached for loan through the power loom association, the review committee and the banks concerned, the reports said The Managing Director of

the BSB expressed the hope that under the guidelines of the model rehabilitation scheme, at least six groups would go into production with the objective of being 100 per cent export-oriented within the next six months.

The newly formed 35 groups would be able to create job opportunities for 50,000 people and produce 48 lakh yards of cloths each annually saving Taka 800 crore in foreign exchange.

SEOUL, Dec 20: US officials pressed North Korea to return a captive American pilot and the body of his colleague during a half-hour meeting today at the Korean War truce village of Panmunjom. The US military, meanwhile was revising procedures for flights along the Korean border to avoid similar incidents, reports AP.

Russian jets strike army targets in Grozny

GROZNY, Dec 20: Russian jets struck homes and military targets in the Chechen capital with rockets today, and Moscow said it had escalated its offensive in the breakaway southern republic, reports AP.

A Chechen spokesman claimed 120 people were killed in three overnight air raids on the capital, Grozny, the radio station Echo Moscow reported.

Protesting the escalating Russian offensive, more than 100,000 Chechen civilians formed a human chain today along the main road across Chechnya. Many held hands and sang; some held placards with such messages as Freedom For Chechnya" and . We Will Not Surrender.

The protest was called by beleaguered Chechen Presi dent Dzhokhar Dudayev, who denounced the Russians for the "mass killing of peaceful citizens.
