Frequent power failure in Madaripur

MADARIPUR, Dec. 26: Frequent power failure in the district has been causing suffering to the domestic consumers as well as hampering production in mills and factories, reports UNB.

Domestic and commercial consumers time and again urged the local Power Development officials to take measures to stop erratic power supply. But no action has yet been taken.

Local people alleged that some corrupt PDB officials are engaged in giving unauthorised connections in exchange of money.

They said most of the areas of the thana and district headquarters plunge into darkness just after sunset causing suffering to the consumers particularly the students. Educational institutions, markets and commercial enterprises are also affected by frequent power disruption.

Smuggled Indian goods flood Sirajganj markets

SIRAJGANJ, Dec. 26: Smuggled Indian goods have flooded the village markets of Sirajganj district.

It is gathered that the rural markets have been flooded with Indian smuggled goods. Jamtoli railway station in Kamar Khanda thana is the main unloading and transit point of smuggled goods. Cotton yarn printed sharee, blouse piece, dyes, sugar, spices, onion, cosmetics, razor blades and many more items are available everywhere in the rural markets.

It is observed that smuggled goods from Chapainawabganj, Rajshahi and Ishardi are brought by local and inter-city trains routes and unloaded at Jamtoli Railway station. An influential quarter is reportedly involved in this evil business and the network is very wide. Smuggled goods are sold openly in the weekly hats and rural markets. The law-enforcing agencies allegedly key mysterious silence about open market-

ing of smuggled Indian goods. Due to rampant entrance of Indian sharees and availability in rural markets demand of local handloom products have sharply fallen. Handloom oriented cottage industries are being closed day by day rendering thousands of weavers employed and ruining national economy.

Fish disease breaks out in Narail

NARAIL, Dec. 26: Fish diseases have broken out in an alarming proportion in all thanas of the district causing concern among the fishermen and consumers, reports UNB.

Demand for the fish has decreased in the local markets due to the outbreak of the disease known as ulcerative syndrome, according to local fisheries officials.

PBS-1 in Natore

Transformers, wires worth Taka 1.45 crore stolen

NATORE, Dec. 26: The journey of Natore Pally Biddut Samitee-1 (NPBS-1) have been facing problems due to stealing of the transformers and wires.

The NPBS-1 has started its 'no loss, no gain' basis journey here in 1981 with a view to earn revenue by selling electricity. It has constructed 1317 kilometres of electricity lines and provided electricity to about 25 thousand consumers since its inception. The samitee is continuing their 'electricity distribution' programme in Shingra, Bagatipara and sadar thanas of Natore district and Puthia and Bagmara thanas of Rajshahi district through the two sub-centres of 15 MVA power plant.

The samitee has increased the electricity-selling by 59,000 KWH during this year. It also has collected over Taka 5.46 crore including some arrears bills of the previous years.

selling electricity worth over Taka 5.26 crore this year.

The samitee has reduced the system loss by 0.55 per cent this year from 15.21 per cent in the last year. For this reason, the samitee could save about Taka 3.55 crore.

The samitee has introduced 'service from one point' programme to ensure rapid and easier service for their consumers. They have served atleast 4,532 consumers under the programme this year.

About 92 village-advisors and 21 village-electricians were given training by the NPBS-1 for increasing the skill in conducting the samitee activities farly.

However, the samitee may still incur a loss as a result of stealing transformers and wires and of the arrears bills.

Thousands of consumers of the samitee have not paid their electricity bills amounting to Taka about 1.30 crore. Of the total amount, about Taka

37.64 lakh still remain to be paid by the irrigation sectors. Most of the consumers of NPBS-1 are farmers who use power for irrigation. About 300 transformers worth about Taka 60 lakh and about 1.07 lakh feet of wires worth about Taka 85 lakh have been stolen from the irrigation consumers during this year.

All of these reports were revealed at the 12th annual member meeting of the samitee held at the samitee premises on December 24. 94. Azir Uddin Ahmed, DC, Natore attended the meeting as the chief guest while Md Nuruzzaman Sarkar, President of NPBS-1 presided over the meeting. Among others, Manzurur Rahman, general manager of the samitee, Omar Ali and Alek Uddin also addressed the meeting.

About two thousand consumers of the samitee and local elite were present at the meeting.

An example worth following

KURIGRAM, Dec. 26: Noor Bakht, once an empty-pocket man, is now boldly established in the society like a brave soldier, with his head held high, setting an example for others to follow his noble path.

Bakht is fifth among five sons of late Ishaque Ali of village Taluk Kaloo of Kathalbari union under Kurigram sadar thana. Noor Bakht inherited only 70 decimals of paternal property at his young age. With his wife, son and daughters, he could hardly maintain his livelihood in those days of his life. He was helpless and found himself in the darkness of poverty. The soon became a day labourer. Noor Bakht was facing defeat in the hands of destiny time and again.

At last, he decided to form a nursery in that small piece of land he inherited. He erected a thatched cottage in a corner of

the piece of land to reside with his wife, son and daughters and started the nursery. He himself worked all day long and employed his wife and children too, in the nursery. At last, fortune showed up.

In 1984, when it was the initial stage of his career in nursery, he had only fifty varieties of plants, with a total quantity of 2,500 of samplings only. At present Noor Bakht has as many as 141 varieties of fruit and nonfruit bearing plants, with a total quantity of about 3 lakh, in his own land. His own land has been extended to 2.5 acres, and his annual income has increased to Taka 75,000. His four other brothers also work in his nursery, which is by far, the biggest of its type in Kurigram district. Such a tremendous progress by an individual initiative is definitely something labulous.

Noor Bakht is now a master in the world of art and culture of nursery in this region of rural Bangladesh. Taking him as an example of success, as many as 42 other enthusiastic individuals have taken this profession of nursery in the district. But the most successful man in this line is again Noor Bakht, who has not yet asked for any benefit from the government in any form.

On December 6, 1993, his nursery activities appeared on a the BTV programme, but that did not attract the attention of the concerned department of the government, he regretted.

In an interview with this correspondent, Noor Bakht said that has great pleasure on this profession. He wishes to help develop the present government afforestation programme until the end of his life. It is his dedication, he added.
