will be saved.

Traffic jam is an acute problem at Aricha and Daulatdia ghats on Dhaka-Khulna highway. Sometimes hundreds of trucks loaded with katcha commodities like fruits, vegetables etc are stranded at the above mentioned ghats for days together owning to insufficient ferry services causing damages to the commodities. Moreover, some transports carrying patients in critical condition on their way to the capital city for emergency treatment are also stranded for several hours resulting in sometimes the patients death. It is only the construction of Padma shetu that can bring the solution to this traffic jam.

Gas is one of the natural gift in Bangladesh. The people' of this south and south-western zone can have access to gas connection only through the "Padma shetu." The extension of the gas connection to this zone will undoubtedly help to develop mills, factories and Padma shetu will directly link industries.

wood coming from trees. Thus gas extension aeross the zone will stop felling of trees resulting in the maintenance of ecological balance of the region. Rail communication which is the best means of communication may be introduced between the capital city and the zone through this multipurpose Padma shetu. It will develop transport facilities, free the passengers and travellers from the sufferings caused by frequent transport

strikes. This rail service will make many of the service holders able to attend their offices in the capital city regularly residing across the river Padma. This will undoubtedly reduce the housing problem in the capital. Agricultural products and consumers goods will get free entrance into different markets to and from the capital through the rail service.

The movement of exportable and importable goods worth crores of taka through Benapol, the only land port of the country will be smooth if Padma shetu is constructed leaving a great impact on the national economy.

In conclusion it may be said that the Padma shetu or Padma bridge will bring the South South-western zone and the capital city into closer contact economically, socially and cul-

Teachers can play vital role in education sector'

HOMNA (Comilla), Dec 30: Shipping Minister M K Anwar Thursday said spread of education and qualitative development of education is imperative to turn the vast masses into human resources, reports

Addressing a teachers conference here organised by local political and social leaders. Anwar said the teacher community has the most significant role to play in this regard.

The conference discussed the problems hindering spread and development of education. The conference, held for the fourth time at Homna was attended by about nine hundred teachers of all the 172 educational institutions of 16 unions of Homna and Daudkandi thanas.

Presided over by Dhaka University teachers and independence day medalist Professor Aminul Islam the conference was addressed, among others, by one of the chief patron of the conference Sirajul Islam, primary and high school and college teachers Abdul

Gaffar, Syed Ali Akbar, Fatema Akhtar Khanam, Monirul Islam and Khursiduzzman.

The minister said, perma nent sustainable development in education sector cannot be achieved ignoring the interest of teacher community. He said, realising this the present government has increased the pay of private school teachers to 80 per cent from the government-grant and provided time scale and medical allowance to them.

Anwar said, primary education has been made compulsory. Food for education, free tuition education, and stipend for girls have been launched and massive infrastructural development programme is being implemented in education sector. Thirty new primary schools have been set up and Taka over six crore has been spent during the tenure of present government at Homna.

However, some pre-conditions have been imposed, which include, meetings of the student bodies should be held before 11-30 am, provocative slogans are prohibited and no procession can be brought out in the campus without prior permission of the Proctor.

Student politics was banned on the campus since October 19, 1993 to curb campus violence, varsity sources said.

Diarrhoea claims two in B'baria

BRAHAMBARIA, Dec 30: Diarrhoea claimed two lives and attacked about a hundred people in three unions of Bancharampur thana in the district in the last fortnight. reports UNB.

According to doctors consumption of adulterated food and taking of impure water are the main reasons behind the outbreak of the disease.

With the passing of days, the disease is spreading fast in Sonarampur; Durgapur, Bancharampur, Ayubpur, Dash Ani and Chai Ani villages. Three medical teams have

been working in the affected areas, official sources said. Another report adds:

Scarcity of fish has been persisting throughout the district for the last two months.

According to a report, the pisciculture in the district has largely been affected by massive siltation in river Titas as well as beels, haors and canals. The unplanned and indiscriminate use of chemical fertelizers and insecticides in crop fields further aggravated the problem.

Meanwhile, the existence of hundreds of professional fishermen are at a stake for not only scarcity of fish but also shortage of fishing materials and increase in their prices.

Many of them left their profession while some others migrated to elsewhere for their survival.

Massive plan to cultivate mustard in Jhenidah

JHENIDAH, Dec 30: The district Agriculture Extension Department has taken up a programme to cultivate mustard in six thanas of the district in the current rabi season, official sources here said. reports UNB. About 8.000 hettares of

land with a production target of 5,635 metric tons have been brought under the programme officials of the Agriculture Extension Department said. Last year's production of mustard was 5,070 metric tons.

Thana-wise breakup of the cultivated land (in hectares): Sadar-2.550, Shailakupa-1.400. Harinakunda-725 Kaliganj-900. Kotchandpur-575 and Moheshpur-1750.

Meanwhile, necessary measures have been taken to supply seeds, pesticides, loans and other agricultural inputs to the farmers.



Seven killed in separate incidents in Jhenidah

JHENIDAH, Dec 30: Seven persons were killed within 4 days in separate incidents in Jhenidah recently.

According to reports, on December 19. Shameem Akter Rantu and Nazmul Islam 29, were travelling on a motor bike no. Dhaka Uma 9583. A truck no. Jessore Ta-1134 from behind dashed them near Camppara. They were rushed to hospital and succumbed to their injuries. The helper of the truck was driving the vehicle, local people alleged. A case was filed with Mohespur thana in this connection, police could not arrest anybody.

According to another report. Tipu Sultan, a boy of about 9 years of age was burnt to death in a paddy boiling chatal at village Ghugri in Mohespur thana on the same

Report says, the ill-fated boy died when he came to en joy fire for protecting himself from cold. Another report says, Belyat

Hossain alias Salok, 32, was chopped to death at village Naopara in Sailkupa thana in the night of December 21. Police said that Salok was

returning home from a local hat. At about 7.30 pm when he reached near Hariana Pashchimpara, a group of people numbering 10 to 12 attacked him with ramda, chapati and hit him on his head. He was rushed to Jhenidah sader hospital in critical condition and succumbed to his injuries.
