# Moscow orders halt to Grozny bombing

ARSHTY, Jan 4: President Boris Yeltsin today ordered a halt to the bombing of the Chechen capital on the fifth day of the Russian army's disastrous attempt to take Grozny, reports AP.

The presidential press service said the bombing halt would take effect at midnight Moscow time (2100 GMT).

The assault on Grozny was preceded by day after day of airstrikes that left hundreds dead and much of the city in

Yeltsin once before said he was stopping the bombing of Grozny, but Russian warplanes

It was not immediately

clear whether Yellsin intended to use the bombing halt to pursue talks with the Chechens. , or whether a new ground assault was being planned.

The press service said Yeltsin was responding to appeals from lawmakers, the media and others to halt the conflict in Chechnya.

"Proceeding from the intention to prevent an increase in civilian casualties, the president of the Russian Federation orders the leaders of the power structures to stop bombing Grozny beginning at midnight Jan. 5," it said.

Despite the bombing halt, Russia poured fresh troops into Chechnya today and geared up for a fresh assault on the Chechen capital.

Hurd expressed the view' during a courtesy call on Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia at the PM office in the evening.

He described the economic progress in Bangladesh as striking but observed that the prevailing political situation may have adverse impact on overseas investment in the country.

"Bangladesh should try its best to maintain stable situation for ensuring development of the country," said the visiting Foreign Minister of the United Kingdom, which has the second highest investment in Bangladesh after Hong Kong. See Page 12 Col 2

### Food Minister tells Daily Star

### Hoarders, hartals push rice prices up

Food Minister Mir Shawkat Ali has attributed the recent price hike of rice to both hoarding of foodgrain and Opposition's agitation programmes.

"A section of the millers. traders and big farmers is hoarding rice to increase their profit while the Opposition programmes like hartals and sieges are also indirectly contributing to the rise in prices of essential commodities," he

Talking to The Daily Star yesterday, the minister said that there was no reason for the price hike since the present food stock with the private sector is adequate to meet the requirement for at least five months and the government also has a satisfactory reserve of rice and wheat.

The price of rice of all varieties has increased by at léast Taka 2 per kg in a month. Coarse rice now sells at Taka 13 to 14 per kg and quality rice from Taka 16 to 17.50.

The minister admitted that there has been an upward trend in the price of rice for about a month. "But the situation is stable

at the moment, and the price is expected to go down soon since steps have been taken for this.

## Political stability must for investment: Hurd

British Foreign and Co. mmonwealth Affairs Secretary Douglas Hurd has 'expressed the hope that an understanding would be reached by the Bangladeshis themselves to resolve the present political crisis for the sake of continuity of the country's democratic process and economic stability.

Addressing a press conference late yesterday afternoon Hurd said that political stability was an essential premise for securing foreign confidence and investment.

Responding to questions on the political situation, the British Foreign Secretary repeatedly emphasised without elaborating: There is a linkage between foreign aid and political stability. Evading a direct reply to

whether British aid would be reduced if the present political crisis continued. Hurd said "Aid is going to be allocated, if it can be well spent." The British Foreign

Secretary said he had listened to several points of view on the political situation and added it's not a matter for me, but for the Bangladeshis to de-

"As a friend of Bangladesh. I hope an agreement can be reached so that economic progress could continue," he said Britain was committed to supporting good government and parliamentary democracy," he added.

Speaking about the economic situation, Hurd said, "I am impressed by the economic progress of the country. Statistics are impressive. There is increasing exports

and inflation rate is very low." Hurd pointed out that many British companies have invested in Bangladesh, and good progress has been made in the textile sector. Responding to a question if

### Israel okays new site for Jewish settlement in WB

AL-KHADER, West Bank. Jan 4: Bulldozers began clearing a new Jewish settlement site in the Israeli-occupied West Bank today as part of a government compromise to save threatened peace talks with the PLO, witnesses said, reports Reuter.

They said buildozers began preparing the ground for housing units on the hillside tract next to another hill where Israeli troops and protesters clashed over plans to build on what Arab villagers said was their land.

On Monday Israel's government, under pressure from its Palestinian peace partners. halted work on the site for 500 apartments on a disputed hilltop near Al-Khader village but authorised work on a location closer to the nearby

Jewish settlement of Efrat. The compromise did little to defuse the dispute over settlement, one of the thorniest points of contention still to be negotiated in the 1993 Israeli-PLO peace deal.


