Weather

Cold spell to persist

Severe cold wave will continue to sweep over the regions of Mymensingh, Pabna, Srimangal and rest of the country except Barisal division during the next 12 hours till 6 pm today, reports UNB.

The Met office forecasts Chittagong and Noakhali regions will be under the grip of moderate cold wave during the period while dry weather is likely to prevail over the country.

Night temperature may fall by 1 to 2 degree Celsius over Barisal division and the regions of Chittagong and Noakhali, it added.

No appreciable change in the temperature over Comilla and Sylhet regions is expected but slight rise is predicted elsewhere over the country.

In the next two days night temperature is likely to rise and little change in the coming week.

Yesterday's lowest temperature of the country was 4.0 degrees Celsius recorded at Srimangal and the highest 27.0 degree at Teknaf.

The sun sets today at 5:25 pm and rises tomorrow at 6:43 am.
