Some 64 foreign firms from 19 countries are expected to participate in the Dhaka International Trade Fair (DITF '95) beginning tomorrow.

Organised by the Commerce Ministry, 132 local firms are also going to participate in the two-week-long fair, the first of its kind in the country, to be held on 15 hectares of land at Sher-e-Bangla Nagar.

Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia is expected to inaugurate the fair as the chief guest at 3:30 pm. Commerce and Information Minister M Shamsul Islam will be the special guest on the occasion.

Preparations for the fair are nearly complete, said Shahee dullah, chief coordinator of the fair. The last minute preparations are also progressing very

The meeting was informed that the Finance Ministry had already sanctioned Tk 266 crore for undertaking the gigantic task of collecting databased information for computer and issuance of laminated identity cards with laser-printed photographs to approximately 55 million eligible voters of the country.


