# OIC states achieve no progress in food security

TEHRAN Jan 15: Muslim countries could have serious trouble feeding their people in the next century, the head of the organisation of the Islamic Conference (OIC) warned here on Saturday, reports AFP.

Despite many efforts, OIC member states have achieved no tangible progress in the area of food security." Hamid Al-Ghabid told agriculture ministers and representatives from 48 Islamic countries.

The main reason is the lack of any effective mechanism at the regional and subregional levels." Ghabid said at the seminar on food security and agricultural development which opened here on Saturday.

Providing food for the world's one billion Muslims will be seriously threatened on the horizon of the year 2000 if collective measures are not taken urgently in the field of agricultural development." Ghabid said.

He said tackling food shortages in Islamic countries was a "priority" for the OIC and called on international organisations to help out.

He also called attention to the problems of famine and malnutrition in the developing and underdeveloped" coun-

'Most developing countries and especially the underdeveloped ones face excessive debts and a constant fall in the price of their agricultural exports."

Iranian President Ali Akbar Hashemi Rafsanjani warned in an opening speech that most OIC member states were dependent on imported food and the situation "could turn into a political problem.

"Agricultural production and trade are becoming more and more dependent on political considerations," he said without elaborating.

The president urged OIC members to set up a "healthy economic and agricultural structure" and engage further in a south-south cooperation through establishing an Islamic common market.

Rafsanjani said Iran had made considerable advances in agriculture, producing 10.8 million tonnes of wheat in 1993 compared with 7.2 mil- Islamic world.

### India bans China shifting FDI policy re-export of

BEIJING, Jan 15: China is shifting foreign direct investment (FDI) policies to favour long term commitments in key sectors, according to a Chinese news analysis Sunday. reports AP.

"If China embraced every kind of foreign investment, sometimes in an unblinking way during the past 15 years. it now chooses to be more selective," the China Daily Business Weekly quoted a Ministry of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation official as saying.

The foreign investment boom in 1991-93 was lead by speculation in real estate, and a large portion of the money went to building luxury offices and housing.

Since last year, overseas investors with long-term commitment to key industries have increased their stakes in China, the report said.

General Electric of the United States, Siemens of Germany and a dozen other European and Japanese corporations received permission to set up holding companies in China last year, and these companies pushed up the level of actual investment, it said.

The large foreign compa nies investing in China tend to

support from Chinese partners who are under increasingly strict central credit controls that are part of the government's measures to bring inflation down.

investment contracts from overseas amounted to dirs 69 billion dollars last year, compared with more than 100 bil lion dollars in 1993. The tight credit policy for speculative investment pushed this amount down, the report said.

But 28.8 billion dollars of foreign capital was actually used last year, compared with 26 billion dollars in 1993.

China will soon publish guidelines for foreign investors that are intended to improve the investment climate, the newspaper said in a separate

More projects, including in the service sector, will be opened gradually to foreign investment, said Zhang Xiaoji of the Development Research Center, a think tank of the State Council.

China plans to encourage foreign investment in agricul tural technology, infrastructure, energy, transportation raw materials, machinery and electronics, petrochemicals, auto making, the building industry and high-tech and exbe less dependent on financial port-oriented projects.

The turnover in volume rose by 8.39 per cent and the turnover in value showed an increase of 16.79 per cent. A total of 35928.00 shares


