

Massive quake kills 1681 in Japan

KOBE, Japan, Jan 17: A massive earthquake pounded central Japan today, killing at least 1681 people and injuring 6334 as buildings, roads and rail lines collapsed and raging fires were ignited, reports Reuter.

Police said 1017 people were missing after the quake, the biggest to hit central Japan in nearly half a century, wreaked its worst destruction in the port city of Kobe and caused damage and other deaths in the major business centre of Osaka.

Cars were left hanging from overhead motorways, railway lines dangled in mid-air and dazed residents clad only in pyjamas picked through piles of rubble and glass.

A stretch of overhead expressway was flipped on to its side, throwing cars to the ground, and trains were catapulted off their tracks by the force of the tremor, which measured 7.2 on the open-ended Richter scale.

Kobe residents formed bucket brigades to try to control fires in the city's downtown area which were still burning 13 hours after the tremor.
