WB private sector industrial credit faces cancellation

A World Bank credit to finance imports by export oriented private industrial units faces cancellation due to a chronic lukewarm response from the entrepreneurs in Dhaka to avail it, reports UNB.

Official sources said staggering failure of the authorities in developing an environmental guideline and standard for the industrial sector has further made the fate of the credit programme uncertain.

A recent World Bank Portfolio Performance Review Mission identified the 18.30 million Special Drawing Rights (about 24 million US dollar) project as "one of the worst performing ones and recommended for its cancellation or reduction.

The Private Sector Industrial Credit, being disbursed by private financial in stitutions for the first time was signed in April, 1992 and became effective a year later.

Although the credit became effective some 22 months back in March 1993, official sources said, only 2.15 million SDR or 11.2 per cent of the credit could be disbursed until November last

Failure of the authorities to initiate development of envi ronmental guidelines and standards for industries is another factor that has particularly frustrated the IDA (International Development Agency), the World Bank's soft load arm.

The guideline was to be developed by the Department of Environment (DOE), as part of the credit programme.

But, according to official sources. DOE has failed to make any beadway in this re-

Fertiliser crisis artificial'

The scarcity of urea fer tiliser in the current peak season is an 'artificial crisis' resulting from unabated smuggling and middlemen's manipulation, knowledgeable sources said, reports UNB.

The government has fixed per metric tons of urea fertiliser at Tk 3.725 against the West Bengal price of about Tk. 6.000 and international price of more than Tk 8.000. As a result, the sources said, huge quantity of urea fertiliser is being sauggled into the neighbouring country.

The price of urea fertiliser was reduced in two phases from Tk 4.725 to Tk 3.725 during the last two fiscal years, Bangladesh Chemical Industries Corporation (BCIC) sources said.

Country's six fertiliser factories under the BCIC produce 22 lakh metric tons of urea fertiliser annually against domestic demand of 18 lakh metric tons

The government has prohibited the export of fertilizer with immediate effect until further order to ensure adequate domestic supply during the current peak season of IRRI rice.

The restriction on fertiliser export is also aimed at check ing any price-hike in the peak season for high-yielding variety of rice that is now on.

Urea is a major exportable item of the country. About four lakh tons of urea were exported in the first six months of the current fiscal year (July December 1994).



ISLAMABAD. Jan 19: Four gunmen bound and gagged several employees of a bank before making off with nearly one million dollars in a daring early morning robbery, news reports said Thursday.
