## Internal revenue mobilisation rises by 23 pc

The Industries Minister, A M Zahiruddin Khan, said that the fiscal reform programmes of the government had started giving positive results, reports BSS.

Speaking as the chief guest at the annual general meeting of the BCS (Taxation) Association at city's Officers' Club Friday, the Industries Minister said that internal revenue mobilisation increased by about 23 per cent in 1993-94 fiscal compared to that of 1991-92.

In 1993-94 internal revenue mobilisation stood at Tk 8995.61 crore while in 1991-92 it was Tk 7347.72 crore.

The minister described it as a 'good sign' for Bangladesh economy that the ratio of internal resource mobilisation in relation to gross domestic product was gradually increasing.

The Industries Minister said that in 1993-94 fiscal internal resource mobilisation increased to 11.4 per cent of the GDP from 9.8 per cent in 1991-92.

## Two-day ICDDR,B confe begins

The fourth annual scientific conference (ASCON IV) of the International Centre for Diarrhoeal Disease Research, Bangladesh (ICDDR,B) was inaugurated at its Sasakawa International Training Centre in the city yesterday, reports BSS.

Director of ICDDR,B Dr Demissie Habte opened the two-day meet and expressed the hope that detailed discussions during the conference would greatly help experts, planners and policy makers in the field of health and family planning.

The inaugural function was also addressed by Lisa Chiles, deputy mission director of the USAID in Dhaka, and Alain P Mouchiroud, country director of the UNFPA, as representatives of the donor agencies and the international agencies respectively.

Earlier, convenor of the ASCON IV, Dr Radheshyam Bairagi explained the aim of this year's conference comprising seven scientific sessions and two symposia on cholera and population.

About 100 delegates and experts, policy makers and development planners from both government and non-government organisations as well as international agencies are taking part in the conference.

Dr Steven W Sinding, director of population sciences division of the Rockefeller Foundation, gave the annual lecture following the inaugural session. Secretary of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare Syed Ahmad was in the chair.

Dr Steven W Sinding said that Bangladesh had shown the world what could be done to extend family planning services under adverse conditions.
