Int'l investment confce begins in city today

A two-day international conference exclusively on Bangladesh's investment potentials begins in the city today with the participation of some 700 delegates including over 220 from abroad.

Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia will inaugurate the conference titled "Bangladesh Investment Conference: The Emerging Tiger" at 9 am at the Sonargaon Hotel.

The conference aimed at focusing on investment opportunities in Bangladesh and attracting foreign investment is being organised jointly by the Board of Investment (BOI) and Euromoney, a London-basedorganisation famous for organising such conferences on emerging markets in the

of emerging markets," the Euromoney said, in an introductory letter to the participants of the conference.

"Continued economic and industrial reforms have created a firm base for controlled growth," the Euromoney said, adding the country now has a five per cent GDP growth, 10 per cent industrial output growth, 20 per cent export growth, foreign exchange reserves worth six months' import, convertible currency and low inflation.

The conference is expected to help the country mobilise foreign investment worth more than two billion US dollars in 1995 and bigger amount in the coming years. organisers said at a press briefing prior to the conference.

Over 176 representatives from leading global and regional fund managers, investment bankers, bankers, securities firms and corporate houses have already registered their names, while some 46 representatives from multinational companies in

PM reviews political situation

By Staff Correspondent Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia yesterday held an emergency meeting with senior ministers and discussed the latest political situation, a ruling party source told The Daily Star last night.

Instead of holding the scheduled cabinet meeting at the Bangabhaban, the Prime Minister met with her kitchen cabinet colleagues.

Detailed discussions of the meeting, which took place at 10 pm. were not available but a BNP source hinted that the ruling party may take a fresh initiative to bring the opposition parties back to Parliament during the current session.

A source in the Opposition said they are still ready to reconsider withdrawing resignations if the ruling party accept their demand for a neutral advisory council under the President during the next general elections.

The source, a senior leader of the Awami League, further said that the AL chief had received a proposal of forming an advisory council with the members of parliament from both sides.

The AL chief rejected that offer, he added.

JS goes into winter session

Resolve crisis thru' consensus: Biswas

President Abdur Rahman Biswas yesterday urged all to uphold the image of the country by reaching a consensus on national issues and said Parliament is the centre for resolving all problems.

"Let us sit across the table and reach a consensus," the President told Parliament which went into its winter session vesterday.

I hope, we, irrespective of parties and ideals, would be able to find out ways to resolve all national crises and Parliament will be the centre for resolving those." President Biswas said at the opening sitting of the 18th session of the fifth Parliament

His 80-minute speech at the first session of the year was telecast and broadcast live.

The President said the suc cess of Parliamentary democracy lies in the concerted efforts of the ruling party and the Opposition. Under the present circumstances "we will have to achieve that cooperation and fellow-feelings," he added

"Our unity for establishing democracy is now a part of the history. In the light of that rich background, it is our duty to consolidate democracy," the President said.

The opposition bench in the House was totally empty as 147 MPs belonging to the Awami League, Jatiya Party, Jamaat-e-Islami and NDP submitted their resignation letters on December 28. Rashed Khan Menon of the Workers Party. Shamsuddhoha of the Gana Forum and Maulana Obidul Huq of IOJ, who have not yet resigned also did not attend the session.

Speaker Shaikh Razzak Ali chaired the one hour and 45 minute-session beginning at 11 am. Minister for Law. Justice and Parliament Affairs Mirza Golam Hafiz introduced four ordinances ahead of the President's address.

Sheikh Hasina said the Prime Minister had committed to give autonomy to radio and television when declaration of three alliances was formulated at the fag end of anti-autocracy agitation.

NARAYANGANJ. Jan 23: One person was killed and at least five others were injured in a fierce gunfight between two groups of local bullies in the Bandar thana area today.

Sabbir, 22, who was leading one of the groups, succumbed to his injuries at Narayanganj Hospital. He was wounded in the shootout in the morning.

Among the injured, condition of Putul, 18, who also sustained bullet wounds, was stated to be critical. Other injured Shahbuddin, 18. Shahjahan, 22. Shamsuddin, 25 and Fakir, 16, were admit-

The fighting occurred when an armed gang led by Mannan of Kaitakhali area of Nabiganj under Bander thana allegedly attacked another group led by Sabbir at Nouradapool area this morning. Local people said the firing that continued for two hours was a sequel to an en-

Both the groups used revolvers, sawed-off rifles and exploded cocktails. A case was registered with Bandar police.


