Kumudini Caters Country Cuisine

if you enjoy eating out and have a liking for typical Bengali cuisine in authentic Begali earthenware, but are on a shoe-string budget. then Kumidini's Coffee shop is the answer for you. Kumidini's is known to many as simply a store where one can buy sarees, shalwar kameezes, jewellery, katha-stich cushion covets and other Bangladeshi handicrafts. But what many don't know is that it is a great place to get a very mouth-watering and authentic Bengali lunch of luchi, aloor dom (potato curry) bhagi (vegetables fry) and booter daal (lentil) with narkel (coconut) served in a terracotta thata (dish) with the daal and aloo served in small earthenware bowls.

It's as tasty as any grandma's hand-made luchi and curry and the best thing about it all is that it'll cost you only Tk 20. A meal on the roadside will eost you Tk 25, which makes a lunch at Kumidini's all the more a novelty. The atmosphere here is also something pleasantly different. One sits on an earthenware mora (cushion) under the shade of a terracotta thatched roof of an open hut surrounded by

on Gulshan Avenue, (between circle 1 and cir-

Also on the menu are deep fried yummies of pakora (Tk one each), samosa (Tk 6 for a plate of two), and shingara (Tk 4 for a plate of two). If you are there at tea time and not in the mood for greasy delights then stop by for a cup of coffee or a cup of tea and two biscuits or 'even, just a cold 7-up. The cost will not exceeding Tk 12.00

The service is a little slow because they will fry you the luchi, shingara or samosa on the spot, but it is compensated for by the amiable cook behind the food and of course, the food itself which is superb. It is all self-serve, so you might have to walk up to the counter a few times and hurry the cook.

A lot of people tend to ignore the little teracotta huts in front of the Kumudini shop, perhaps because they are semi shaded by the greenery. But next time you are out shopping or just even in the mood for a great meal, try the delights in store for you for a bargain at the pointed.
