Trade union leaders of the jute and textiles sectors are scheduled to meet at a convention in the city this morning to chart out a fresh agitation programme to realise their de mands.

The new action programmes of the workers may include road-rail barricades and strikes early next month. trade union sources said.

Today's convention will be held near the CPB office at 10 in the morning.

Four trade unions and federations of this sector enforced a 72-hour road-rail blockade and strike during January 22-24 to press their demands which include an official declaration by the government that it would implement the mid-1992 government-trade bodies accords.

The fresh agitation will also be in protest against alleged police atrocities which resuited in the deaths of two industrial workers and injuries to several hundred during the just-concluded nationwide barricade programme. Punishment of those responsible for the deaths, compensation for the victims' families and release of those arrested during the recent unrest are also among the labour leaders' demands.

The 1992 agreements provided for a new wages commission for the workers, consultation with the relevant labour leaders pftor to disinvesting any industrial unit, re-
