Diplomats agree to principles of global poverty alleviation plan

After two weeks of debate, diplomats have agreed to the principles of a global plan to fight poverty, but left the biggest issue unresolved: how to pay for it. reports AP.

The ambitious draft declara-'tion, which was agreed to on Friday and is to be signed at a March 6-12 summit in Copenhagen. Denmark, says the world must focus on "eradicating poverty" and creating full employment.

The plan also calls for freer markets and liberalized trade to promote economic growth. but does not include firm commitments on funding poverty programmes or clear target dates for its goals.

Other contentious points. such as cancelling the debt of impoverished countries and using more foreign aid for antipoverty programmes, were left for discussion at the summit

\$600m secured to save IFAD

from collapse ROME, Jan 28: The United Nations fund to help the rural poor has secured 600 million US dollars in donations to save it from collapse, officials sa'c vesterday, reports Reuter.

"Before the session we thought we were going to be shut down. The fund was destitute. But the pledges have ensured that the fund can carry on its work," said a spokesman for the UN International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) He said the fund received

pledges from Western industrialised nation, members of OPEC (the Organisation of Petroleum Exporting Countries) and developing nations.

We had a very successful session in which we secured enough pledges for the fund's replenishment and also agreed on key restructuring," said the fund's President Fawzi Al-

India's budget. may delay for two weeks

NEW DELHI, Jan 28, India's annual federal budget what contains the economic reform package for the year, will be delayed by at least two weeks. government sources said Friday, reports AP.

The budget, presented on February 28 each year, was put off until mid-March because India's Election Commission asked the government not to announce new proposals that may influence voters ahead of elections for new legislatures in six states beginning next month.

Aid organizations and other groups have already said they were concerned that the World Summit for Social Development - slated to cost the United Nations 2.8 million dollars - will end up as nothing more than a debating ses-

"A huge diplomatic circus of heads of state is just not going to be productive," said Jeffrey Laurenti, Executive Director at the United Nations Association of the United States, a private policy research group.

"You can't even get an agreement on the nature and solutions for these problems in wealthy countries," Laurenti said. The prospects of getting them to agree on providing resources for the colossal prob-

iems in the poor countries is hopeless.

The United States and many European nations were cool to the idea of a summit when it was first proposed in 1991 and have demanded that the summit agenda not include calls for an increase in foreign aid or blanket debt relief for developing countries.

"Governments are not spending more money," said Timothy Wirth, the head of the US delegation to the preparatory conference. "We are learning how to deal with less resources."

Delegates met late Friday and largely completed the agenda they will take to Copenhagen, leaving only procedural details to be worked out Saturday.

They did not agree on the agenda's call to eliminate the debt of developing countries and left leaving that for further

discussion at Copenhagen. Also left for the summit is a

proposal first mooted by UNICEF and now backed by the United States for all na tions to devote 20 per cent of their national budgets to anti poverty and employment pro grammes at home. Many developing nations have not even reached half that level, Wirth said, while the United States exceeds it.

The proposal also calls for industrialized nations to devote 20 per cent of their foreign aid to poverty and employment programmes.

Summit organizers view the meeting as crucial to focusing attention on fighting poverty.

"This is the first time in history that we have reached a consensus that poverty is morally and politically intoler able," said Chilean Ambassador Juan Somavia, the summit or-· ganizer.

Move to modernise capital markets

Delhi lifts 38-year-old ban on options contracts

NEW DELHI, Jan 28: The Indian government announced vesterday an end to a 38-year old ban on options contracts opening the door to a wide range of new financial instruments in one of the most promising developing economies, seports Reuter

The surprise decision marked a major step in the modernisation of India's capi tal markets and their integration with overseas financial centres

it was the latest move by Prime Minister P V Narasimha Rao's government to bring India's economy shielded for more than four decades from most foreign influence, closer to the global mainstream.

It's a major change," a se nior government official said. Senior Finance Ministry of

ficials P J Nayak said the ban on options was anachronistic. and securities houses had been pressing the government to lift it to let them to hedge risk more effectively.

Options give a buyer the right but not the obligation to buy or sell a financial instrument at a fixed price before or on a certain date in the future. Investors often use options to manage risk but they can also be used to speculate.

The Senior Executive Director of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI), C B Bhave, said the decision to-end the ban on options effectively cleared the way for the creation of futures markets

"Now if you want to start an options and futures exchange for securities, you can," Bhave told Reuters

Futures are agreement to deliver or take delivery of a standardised amount of an underlying financial instrument of commodity at a standardised price in the future at a predetermined price.

Officiais said a ban on fer ward trading of shares, imposed following a 1.3 billion US dollar securities scanda in 1992, would remain in effect, Forward contracts are cash transactions under which a

buyer and seller agree on the delivery of a specified quality and quantity of a commodity of other goods at a specified future date. Prices may be set beforehand or at delivery Brokers welcomed the end

to the ban on options.

"The amendment of allowing future options in the stock market by the government will stabilise the stock market, said Sikander Lal Kohli of broking firm Sfkander Lai

'It is good for the market Operators thus have the option to bail themselves out."

The government also gave substantial new powers to the Sebi, which regulates securities trade.

It won authority over capital issues and the transfer of securities, which previously had been regulated by the Industry Ministry.

Sebi was given the power to levy civil fines on securities houses. Previously, the regulator could only suspend and cancel firms registration, or press criminal charges moves the government said often forced firms to close. hurting innocent business partners.

The government also allowed stock exchanges to set up additional trading floors.


