4 killed, 40 hurt in road accidents

At least four people died and 40 others were injured in three accidents yesterday on the Dhaka-Aricha highway. reports UNB.

A Dhaka-bound night coach overturned on roadside near Savar Cantonment at about 6 am, killing an unidentified young man and a 10-year-old boy, Sulan.

The unidentified man died on the spot and the boy succumbed to his injuries on the way to Dhaka for treatment, witnesses said

Some 36 people were also injured in the accident.

In another accident, a helper of a speeding truck died instantly and five others were injured seriously when the truck collided with a microbus coming from Dhaka and both skidded into a 400-footdeep ditch at Jorpool.in Savar thana at about 8 am.




